Subsequent to the successful completion of the Membership in General Dentistry (MGD) training program 2009-2011, The College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong (CDSHK) and Hong Kong Dental Association (HKDA) came to an agreement in May 2012 for HKDA to be the administrator of the MGD training program 2012-2014.

The training program is designed to prepare the MGD trainees for the MGD Part I and Part II examinations. It is a competence-based program according to the guidelines of accreditation and training in MGD. For further details, please refer to CDSHK's website ([www.cdshk.org](http://www.cdshk.org)).

The training program is module-based, consisting of CGD (Committee of General Dentistry) accredited lectures and workshops on clinical practice and essentials of dental practice on General Dentistry. There are some supporting programs to guide trainees in examination preparation.

He also holds a number of honorary and visiting professor positions in major dental schools in China. He is the Chairman of the Specialty Board of Community Dentistry in the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong. Professor Lo is a renowned expert in oral epidemiology, preventive dentistry and community dentistry and he has been invited to give presentations in a number of major international dental conferences and written more than 140 scientific journal articles and book chapters.

Synopsis : There are different types of oral health care system in different countries, and Hong Kong, as a Special Administrative Region in China, has its own unique system. The behaviors of both the oral health care providers and consumers are influenced by the structure, organization, and financing of the oral health care system. The first part of the presentation will describe the development and the current oral health care system in Hong Kong. The activities and role of the oral health care providers in the public and private sectors will be covered.

The second part of the presentation will focus on the effectiveness of various kinds of preventive oral health interventions, especially those which can be implemented in community-based programs. The role of dental profession in promoting the oral health of the population, with particular focus on the situation in Hong Kong, will be discussed.

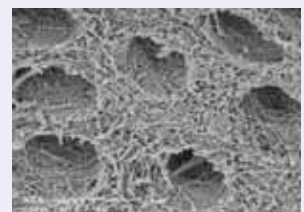
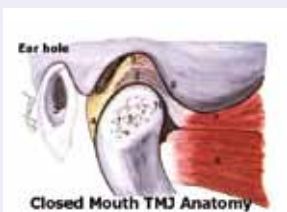

Dr Michael Burrow held the positions of Professor in Restorative Dentistry, Clinical Dean of the Melbourne Dental School, and Restorative Dentistry Discipline Head at the Melbourne Dental School, University of Melbourne and was a visiting Prosthodontist at the Royal Dental Hospital of Melbourne. He has taken up the position of Clinical Associate Professor in Oral Diagnosis & Polyclinics and Undergraduate Program Director in Operative Dentistry at the Faculty of Dentistry of the University of Hong Kong last year. He was a member of the Australian Dental Association DIME Committee and Australian delegation member attending ISO TC 106 on dental standards. He is currently serving on the Editorial Boards of five international journals and published over 150 refereed papers and he has lectured in Australia and Internationally.

Professor Ian Meyers is currently an Honorary Professor at The University of Queensland School of Dentistry and James Cook University School of Medicine and Dentistry, and he also maintains a private dental practice in Brisbane, Australia. His research and teaching are mainly focused on the applied dental biomaterials area and he has run many postgraduate and continuing education courses. He is a product consultant with various dental companies and he is a member of numerous local and national dental committees. His major interests include clinical use of dental materials, diagnosis and management of the worn dentition, and teaching and development in general practice dentistry.

A/Prof Neil Peppitt is currently a Clinical Professor at The University of Sydney School of Dentistry whilst maintaining a Specialist Prosthodontic dental practice in Sydney, Australia. His training and practice cover all areas of Prosthodontics; Crown and Bridge, Partial and Full Dentures, Maxillofacial prostheses, Implants and Jaw function. He has run many postgraduate and continuing education courses. He is a clinical consultant with various dental companies. He has been involved integrally in the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons, Australian Dental Association and numerous states, federal and international boards and committees.

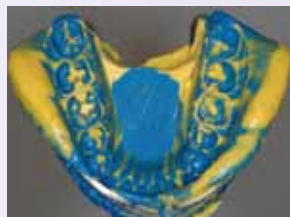
