A/Professor Douglas Stewart is the Program Director of the Graduate Diploma in Clinical Dentistry (Conscious Sedation & Pain Control) at the University of Sydney. Following completing his dental studies at the University of Sydney, he travelled to the United Kingdom and took a keen interest in sedation, pain management and medical emergencies. Upon his return to Australia in 1995, he then involved with teaching sedation, pain management and resuscitation at Westmead Hospital and the University of Sydney. He is also a senior staff specialist and head of Department, Clinical Support, at the Westmead Centre for Oral Health.

A/Professor Stewart is the Chairman of the Advisory Board and Immediate Past President of the International Federation of Dental Anesthesiology Societies, the Oral Health Foundation, and the Dental Alumni Society of the University of Sydney and is the Honorary Secretary of the Australian Society for Dental Anaesthesiology. He is also a Consultant on Sedation for the RACDS and an examiner for the MRACDS.

Synopsis : The first part of the presentation will address the common causes of collapse and medical emergencies in the dental setting. The basic physiology, anatomy and pharmacology will be covered including vaso-vagal syncope, cardiac arrest, anaphylaxis, laryngospasm, diabetes and seizures. Drugs and equipment will be discussed in the treatment of emergencies and there will be a great emphasis on teamwork.

The second part of the presentation will examine simulated medical emergencies and how we can learn practical lessons from them. The background of medical simulation comes from critical flight simulation where pilots practice critical care without crisis to their passengers or staff. The use of Anaesthetic Crisis Resource Management (ACRM) will be encouraged and these principles include know your environment, anticipate and plan, call for help early enough, take a leadership role, communicate effectively, allocate attention wisely and use all available information, and, finally, distribute the workload and utilise all available resources.

This lecture emphasizes the importance of responding rapidly to emergencies in order to avoid disaster in the dental setting!

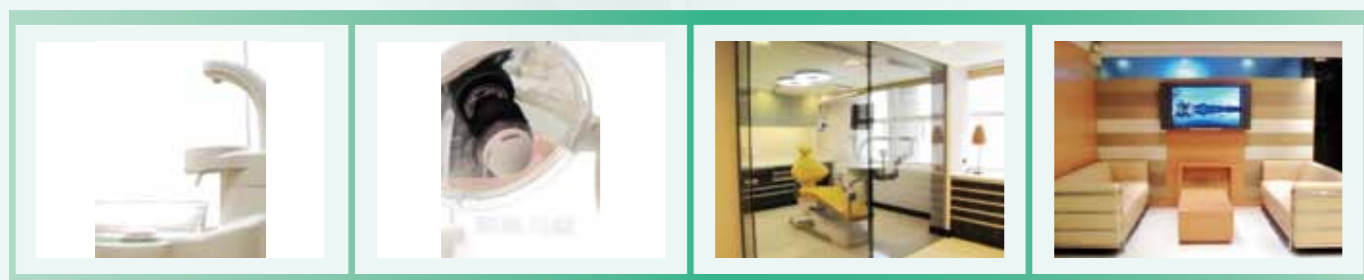

Infection Control

Professor Walsh holds a personal chair as Professor of Dental Science at the University of Queensland, and has served as the Head of the UQ School of Dentistry for the past 10 years. He is a registered dental specialist in Special Needs Dentistry, and he maintains a part-time clinical practice in that discipline in Brisbane. Professor Walsh has been a member of the Australian Dental Association national infection control committee for the past 13 years, the past 4 years as its chair. He has served for many years on regulatory boards and national standards committees, and is the major contributing author of the Australian national guidelines on infection control.

Professor Walsh received his undergraduate education in dentistry and then his PhD in immunopathology at the University of Queensland. He then undertook his postdoctoral education at the University of Pennsylvania Medical School, followed by a higher doctorate in pathology. He is a fellow of the Faculty of Oral Pathology of the Royal College of Pathologists of Australasia. Professor Walsh has been lecturing and examining in microbiology for the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons since 1999. His research interests are in advanced technologies and clinical microbiology. He has published widely on microbial aspects of oral diseases, and holds patents on a number of diagnostic technologies and clinical chairside tests for use in clinical dental practice.

Synopsis : The first part of the lecture will examine the challenges of successful infection control within the dental operatory, beginning with recent events where spread of infection in dental practice has attracted international media attention, and then looking specifically at the pathways of transmission and the methods which can be used to address these, including both standard and risk-based precautions. Specific attention will be paid to diseases spread by contact, droplets and aerosol routes, and comments will be made on the performance of personal protective equipment.

The second part of the lecture will examine the sequence from chairside use of instruments and cycle of reprocessing, focusing on various points where problems occur, including the handling of sharps, instrument packaging systems, determining whether an item has been cleaned properly, and how to configure and validate a load for a steam sterilizer. A summary of methods used to verify performance of sterilizers will be presented.
