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## President's Report

This is my first report as the College President. The past year has been a busy one with many activities. There were changes in the Council membership and College office-bearers. We had Dr May HO joining the Council for the first time. Dr Robert NG took up the position of Vice-President (Education & Examinations) and Dr Katherine LEUNG became the new Censor-in-chief.

The Education & Examinations Committee had continued to work hard, overseeing the training of basic and higher trainees and the examination arrangements in the eight specialties, as well as the activities of the Committee of General Dentistry. Our College had continued to collaborate closely with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh in the conduct of Conjoint Intermediate Examinations in Endodontics, Periodontology, Prosthodontics, Orthodontics, and Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery in last November. Exit Examinations were conducted in the specialties of Endodontics, Periodontology, Orthodontics, and Paediatric Dentistry. Ten new College Fellows were admitted by the Academy in June this year as FHKAM (Dental Surgery). I would like to congratulate them on their accomplishment. Our College had also worked closely with the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons (RACDS) in offering training to our MGD trainees which was administered by the Hong Kong Dental Association, and in preparing for conducting the next diet of Membership Examination in 2014. The possibility of having conjoint Intermediate Examination in Community Dentistry with the RACDS was discussed and the sentiments were positive.

A successful Spring Scientific Meeting with over-whelming demand for attendance was held on 26 May 2013. The theme of the meeting was “Diagnosis and Management of Orofacial Pain” and we had invited a local medical specialist as well as an overseas expert to be the speakers. The theme of the Winter Scientific Meeting to be held on 1 December 2013 would be on “Management of Endodontic and Periodontal Infections” and internationally renowned speakers from Canada and from Switzerland were invited. The good work of Dr May HO and her committee members in organizing these high quality educational scientific meetings was to be applauded.

This year is the end of the 2011-13 CME/CPD cycle and the next 3-year cycle will start on 1 January 2014. The new “Principles & Guidelines on CME/CPD (2014-16)” was uploaded to our College website for members' information. Our CME/CPD Sub-committee under the chairmanship of Dr Sai Kwing CHAN had vetted and approved a number of local CME/CPD providers, and prepared a list of pre-approved overseas dental meetings to facilitate our College members plan their CME/CPD activities.

CDSHK Scholarship was established by the College to support Higher Trainees and young Fellows to obtain clinical training outside Hong Kong. This year there were two recipients, Drs Cheuk Hang SO and Evelyn HO. Our College is committed to promote the training of dental specialists for the benefit of the public.

This summer, our College supported the Hong Kong Dental Association in organizing the 2013 Hong Kong International Dental Expo and Symposium. There was a College booth in the exhibition area to introduce the activities of the College to the participants from Hong Kong and overseas.

Our College was among the four Academy colleges that were involved in the 2009 pilot scheme on medical/dental specialist training and registration in the Chinese Mainland initiated by the then Ministry of Health. On 16 May 2013, I delivered a report on our College's work in relation to this scheme to Vice-minister Sun Zhigang of the National Health & Family Planning Commission (NHFPC) when he visited the Academy in Hong Kong. Our College Vice-President (General Affairs & CPD), Dr Sai Kwing CHAN, joined a delegation organized by the Academy to visit the NHFPC in Beijing this October.

In 23-24 August 2013, I joined the Academy delegation to attend the 2nd Tripartite Congress of the AMM (Academy of Medicine of Malaysia), AMS (Academy of Medicine of Singapore) and HKAM held in Singapore and strengthened the friendship between our counterparts from Singapore and Malaysia. Two days later on August 26 in Singapore, I attended a meeting with the presidents from the College of Dental Surgeons Singapore and the RACDS to share information about our three colleges and to explore possible means to strengthen our fraternity. Positive attitudes were expressed, and sharing of resources and expertise such as organizing joint scientific meeting was identified as a possible step towards greater collaboration among the dental colleges in the Asia Pacific region.

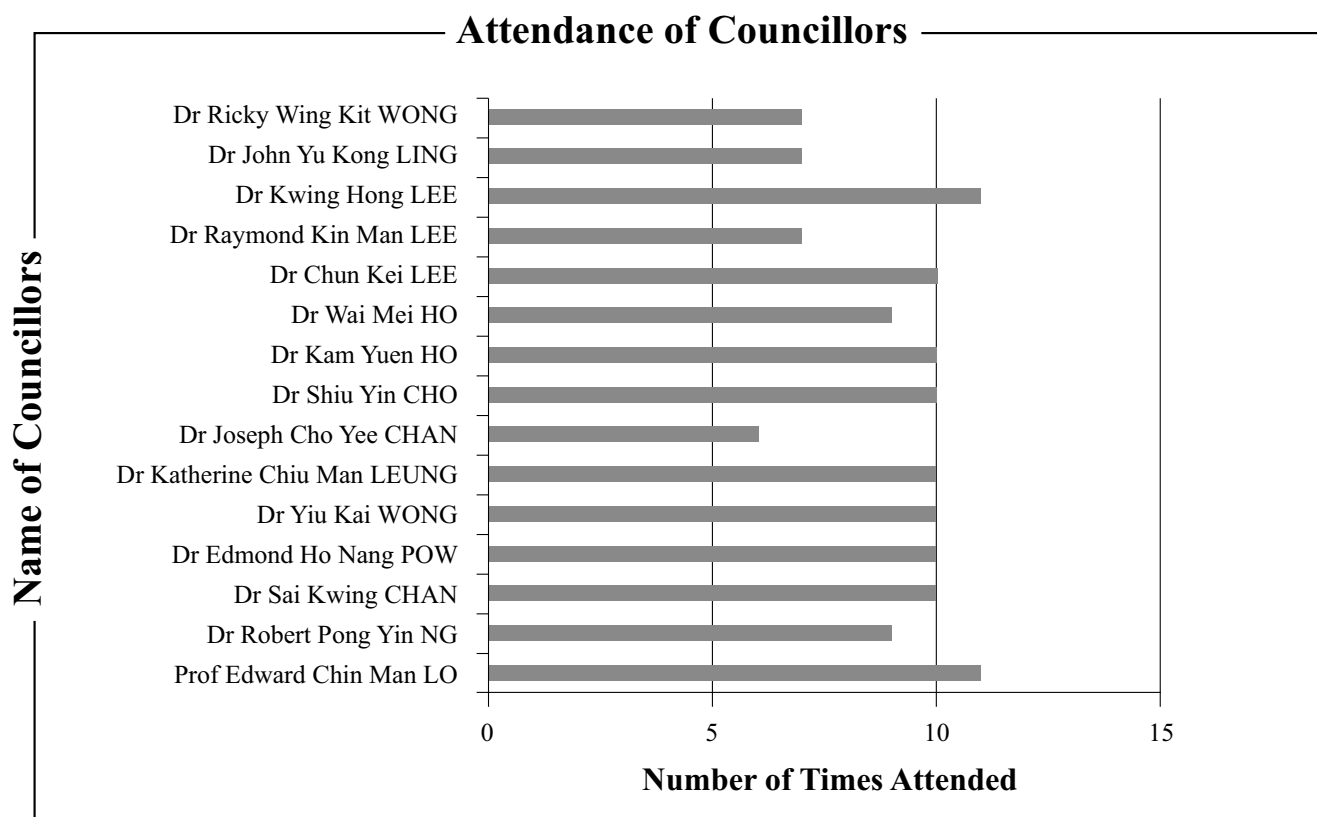

There were two candidates for the Conjoint MOMS examination and one candidate for the MOMS examination. The examination was helmed by the chief examiner Prof Nabil SAMMAN. The examiners from the Edinburgh College were Mr Michael HAHN & Mr John ROWSON. Dr Sit Ka Fai and Dr Ho Lai In passed the conjoint exam. The candidate for the MOMS exam was unsuccessful.
- The next diet of Conjoint MOMS(RCSEd), CDSHK(OMS) Intermediate Examination will be held from 25 to 29 November 2013. Prof Nabil SAMMAN will be the Chief Examiner. A total of 3 candidates enrolled for this diet, 2 for the Conjoint Examination and one for the MOMS(RCSEd) Exam only.
- Exit examination was not held this year as there are no eligible higher trainees for the examination.
- The next diet of Exit examination will be conducted in Mar/April 2014. Prof L K CHEUNG will be the Chief Examiner.
- At the close of August 2013, there are a total of 9 higher trainees and 8 basic trainees registering with the College. Their training progress will be evaluated in September with the Trainee Evaluation Form as assessed by their supervisors and trainers.

# Continuing Medical Education Sub-committee

## 1. Introduction

By excelling the concept of Continuing Medical Education (CME) into Continuous Professional Development (CPD), passive, receptive continuing education activities have been gradually replaced by active, self-initiated professional development. Lifelong learning is not only a necessity for health professionals but also a form of protection for our patients

CME/CPD activities must be ensured to be free from commercial influence and based on the best scientific evidence available. The CME Subcommittee maintains that there must be a separation of promotion from education.

The requirement for CME/CPD is constantly evolving to keep pace with what are expected from the profession by our patients and the community. A new Principle and Guidelines for the cycle 2014-2016 has been adopted by the Council of the CDSHK.

## 3. HKAM Programme (CME/CPD Cycle from 1 January 2011 to 31 December 2013) for Fellows:

At present, the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong (CDSHK) has a total of 251 Fellows, in which 13 of them were new Fellows joining our college during the current CME/CPD cycle commencing 1 January, 2011, with the following breakdown:

**9. Applications for accreditation of CME/CPD activities for the first 8 months in 2013 of the current CME/CPD cycle:**

From 1 January 2013 and up to the 31 August 2013, our CME Subcommittee has vetted, approved, and accredited a total of 482 scientific meetings or training courses held locally and overseas.

## **10. Differences in CME/CPD points calculation**

The HKAM has set a mandatory CME/CPD requirement for all her affiliated Colleges since the year 1995. So the CDSHK has our set of guidelines in accrediting CME points on dentally or medically related courses, following closely to those requirements set by HKAM.

In 2002, the DCHK introduced a voluntary CPD points programme, in which the Hong Kong Dental Association (HKDA) and CDSHK have been appointed as both programme accreditors and administrators (Department of Health being the third programme administrator, but not as an accreditor).

The CDSHK CME/CPD programme targets at Fellows, whereas the DCHK CPD programme targets at all dentists. Not only do they have different sets of guidelines, they have different calculation methods and their respective number of points required per 3-year cycle also differ. Nonetheless we have not lost sight of our common goals of lifelong professional education and patient protection.

The CME Subcommittee applauds the introduction of “Essential CPD Requirements” in the areas of medical emergency or infection control, risk management and radiology in 2010 by the DCHK.

With the understanding granted by the DCHK, all Fellows and MGD Holders, upon completing their College CME/CPD requirements, are now recognized en bloc and deemed to have completed the DCHK voluntary “CPD Programme for Practising Dentists”. Rather than accepting this as an “exemption”, all fellows and MGD holders are obliged to fulfill such voluntary requirements on par with what are expected from all registered dentists.

## **11. Future development**

A new set of Principle and Guidelines for the cycle 2014-2016 has been announced. There further fine-tunings on the calculation of various CME/CPD activities. A list of accredited CME/CPD providers is attached. As a general rule, commercial promotion activities organized by the industry will not be credited. The line between commercial promotion and professional education will continue to be observed in the best interest of our patients.

The College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong held 2 Scientific Meetings since the last report.

A Winter Scientific Meeting was held on 18th November 2012 at the HKAM Jockey Club Building. Professor Finbarr ALLEN, Professor/Consultant in Oral Rehabilitation and Prosthodontics, and Dean of Dentistry at University Dental School and Hospital, Cork, Ireland made an informative presentation on the various approaches to maintain a functional dentition to the end of life, and the strategies for coping with tooth loss in geriatric patients. Our second speaker, Dr. Chun Bon LAW, Specialist in Internal Medicine and in Geriatrics, and designated Chief of Service at the Department of Medicine and Geriatrics of the Princess Margaret Hospital shared his experience in managing elderly patients with neuro-cognitive disorder with an emphasis on obtaining consent for treatment, and updated the participants on anti-thrombotic treatment. This whole-day meeting was well-attended with over 230 participants and generously supported by a number of dental companies. Feedbacks from the participants were very positive.

The Spring Scientific Meeting was held on 26 May 2013 in Lecture Theatre One of the Prince Philip Dental Hospital. The theme of the meeting was “Diagnosis and Management of Orofacial Pain. Professor David Wray, Dean of Dubai Dental Medicine, as well as Dr Steven HS Wong, Consultant Anaesthesiologist of the Queen Elizabeth Hospital were the invited speakers.

We had a full house with 265 dentists attending the meeting. The general feedback was very positive. Professor Wray talked about orofacial pain with particular emphasis on the non-odontogenic aspects. Non-odontogenic pain could be organic or neuropathic in nature. The whole range of organic pain conditions affecting the face was considered along with their diagnosis and management. Chronic neuropathic pain was discussed in details including the mechanisms involved and the diagnosis and management of neuropathic pain. A holistic approach to the management of chronic pain was emphasized.

In the other half of the meeting, Dr Wong discussed the experience in management of non-odontogenic chronic orofacial pain in Hong Kong. Pain clinics have been set up by anaesthesiologists with special interest in pain management in major public hospitals in Hong Kong since early 1990s. Patients suffering from chronic pain and who were refractory to conventional treatment were seen on a tertiary referral basis. Patients, suffering from orofacial pain of non-dental origin, that were followed up at the Pain Clinic at Queen Elizabeth Hospital were analyzed with an aim to give a brief overview of the common causes of pain and the different modalities of management. At the end of the meeting, several interesting questions were raised from the floor. Overall, we had a very fruitful discussion on this interesting and pertinent topic.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the members of the Scientific Meetings Committee for their support. I am also indebted to Dr S K CHAN, Dr Robert P Y NG, Dr Simon K Y HO and Professor W K LEUNG for their immense help in organization of the Scientific Meetings. Last but not least, I have to express my gratitude to Ms Rose CHOW and the College Secretariat for their unfailing support in organizing these meetings.

I would like to report on the Training, Examination – preparation and execution of the second diet on Membership in General Dentistry (MGD) by full examination and Credit Accumulation and Transfer (CAT).

#### MGD Training Programme 2012-2014 - Lectures

Clinical Modules (CP) - a total of 20 lectures and 2 workshops had been completed by Early July 2013. In the July lecture, we were very pleased to have invited RACDS speakers : Dr Michael BURROW, Prof Ian MEYERS and A/Prof Neil PEPPITT to deliver topics on Dental Material Science, Rehabilitative Therapy, Cosmetic Therapy as well as Information Management and Critical Thinking. Their valuable experience had tremendously benefited our Trainees and, more importantly, their contribution serves as a benchmark to the high standard of our MGD Programme.

The rest of the 16 lectures are Essential of Dental Practice Modules (EDP), Supervised Dental Practice Programme Modules (SDP) as well as 2 workshops which will be completed in December 2013. We will also invite RACDS speakers, Prof Laurence Walsh and A/Prof Douglas Stewart, who will share with us Infection Control and Medical Emergencies for the October and November 2013 lectures respectively.

#### MGD Part I and II Examination 2014 (by Full Exam & 2009-2011 diet candidates)

A total of 49 applications have been received for the Part I Examination – 41 out of 50 trainees by full exam and 8 out of 18 re-sit trainees have been admitted to sit for the exam which will take place on 5 January 2014 (Sunday) at the Prince Philip Dental Hospital.

The Part II Examination (Clinic Visitation) and MGD/MRACDS Conjoint Viva Examination / MGD Unseen Viva Examination would be tentatively held on 18-21 August 2014 and 22 or 23 August 2014 respectively.

#### MGD Part II Examination (by Credit Accumulation and Transfer - CAT 1 and CAT 2)

There is a total 22 candidates sitting the said exam (Clinic Visitation) which will be conducted on 17-19 February 2014.

#### External Examiners

CGD have invited Dr Brent Weller and Prof Trevor Burke to be the External Examiners in the CAT Part II Examination 2014. We will also invite RACDS Examiners to take part in the MGD Part I and II Examination 2014 and are very grateful for their support in the examination.



## NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### 1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong (“the college”) was incorporated in Hong Kong on 23<sup>rd</sup> February, 1993 as a company limited by guarantee. Every member of the college undertakes to contribute, if required, an amount not exceeding HK\$100 to the assets of the college in the event of its being wound up.

The address of the registered office of the college is Room 902, HKAM Jockey Club Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Aberdeen, Hong Kong.

The college is engaged in promoting for the public benefit the advancement of knowledge in the field of dental surgery and its associated subjects and promoting training and research in dental surgery.

The financial statements are presented in Hong Kong dollars which is the same as the functional currency of the college.

### 2. CHANGES IN ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The HKICPA has issued several amendments to HKFRSs that are first effective for the current accounting period of the college. Of these, the following developments are relevant to the college’s financial statements:

- Amendments to HKFRS 7, *Financial instruments: Disclosures – Transfers of financial assets*
- Amendments to HKAS 12, *Income Taxes – Deferred tax: Recovery of underlying assets*

Amendments to HKFRS 7, *Financial instruments: Disclosures*

The amendments to HKFRS 7 require certain disclosures to be included in the financial statements in respect of transferred financial assets that are not derecognised in their entirety and for any continuing involvement in transferred financial assets that are derecognised in their entirety, irrespective of when the related transfer transaction occurred. However, an entity need not provide the disclosures for the comparative period in the first year of adoption. The college did not have any significant transfers of financial assets in previous periods or the current period which require disclosure in the current accounting period under the amendments.

Amendments to HKAS 12, *Income taxes*

Under HKAS 12 deferred tax is required to be measured with reference to the tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the entity expects to recover the carrying amount of asset(s) in question. In this regard, the amendments to HKAS 12 introduced a rebuttable presumption that the carrying amount of investment property carried at fair value under HKAS 40, Investment property, will be recovered through sale. This amendment has no effect on the college’s financial statements for prior years and current year.

The college has not applied any new standard or amendment that is not yet effective for current accounting period (see note 13).

### 3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the periods presented, unless otherwise stated.

a) Basis of preparation:

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with HKFRSs (which also include Hong Kong Accounting Standards and Interpretations) issued by the HKICPA, accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with HKFRSs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenditure. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgments about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

b) Property, plant and equipment:

Property, plant and equipment, other than construction in progress are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The cost of an asset comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition and location for its intended use. Expenditure incurred after the property, plant and equipment have been put into operation, such as repairs and maintenance, is normally charged to the statement of comprehensive income in the period in which it is incurred. In situations where it can be clearly demonstrated that the expenditure has resulted in an increase in the future economic benefits expected to be obtained from the use of the property, plant and equipment, the expenditure is capitalised as an additional cost of that asset.

Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is calculated by the straight-line method to allocate cost to their residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

College gowns	20% per annum
Leasehold improvement	20% per annum
Furniture and fixtures	20% per annum
Office equipment	20% per annum

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date. An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

b) Property, plant and equipment: (cont'd)

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognized upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected to arise from the continued use of the asset. The gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net sale proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset is included in the statement of comprehensive income in the year in which the item is derecognized).

c) Inventories:

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is calculated by using the weighted average method. Net realizable value is determined by management based on prevailing market conditions.

d) Impairment:

At each balance sheet date, the college reviews internal and external sources of information to determine whether the carrying amounts of its tangible assets have suffered an impairment loss or impairment loss previously recognised no longer exists or may be reduced. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated, based on the higher on its net selling price and value in use.

If the recoverable amount of an asset is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is reduced to its recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognised as an expenditure immediately.

A reversal of impairment losses is limited to the carrying amount of the asset that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised in prior years. Reversal of impairment losses is recognised as income immediately.

Impairment loss on financial assets which is carried at amortised cost is measured as the difference between the asset's carrying amount the present value of estimated future cash flows discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate.

e) Revenue recognition:

Income from subscription and entrance fees is recognised on an accruals basis.

Income from meeting, course and examination is recognised upon completion of services provided.

Interest income is recognised as it accrues using effective interest method.

f) Related parties:

(a) A person, or a close member of that person's family, is related to the college if that person:

- i) has control or joint control over the college;
- ii) has significant influence over the college; or
- iii) is a member of the key management personnel of the college or the college's parent.

(b) An entity is related to the college if any of the following conditions applies:

- i) The entity and the college are members of the same group.
- ii) One entity is an associate or joint venture of the other entity (or an associate or joint venture of a member of a group of which the other entity is a member).
- iii) Both entities are joint ventures of the same third party.
- iv) One entity is a joint venture of a third entity and the other entity is an associate of the third entity.
- v) The entity is a post-employment benefit plan for the benefit of employees of either the college or an entity related to the college.
- vi) The entity is controlled or jointly controlled by a person identified in (a).
- vii) A person identified in (a)(i) has significant influence over the entity or is a member of the key management personnel of the entity (or of a parent of the entity).

Close members of the family of a person are those family members who may be expected to influence, or be influenced by, that person in their dealings with the entity.

g) Cash and cash equivalents:

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and demand deposits, and short term highly liquid investments which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value, and have a short maturity of generally within three months when acquired, less bank overdrafts which are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the college's cash management.

#### h) Retirement benefit costs:

The college joins a defined contribution retirement scheme under the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance (the "MPF Scheme") for those employees of the college.

The college's contributions to the MPF Scheme are made based on a percentage of the eligible employees' relevant income as defined in the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance. These contributions are expensed as incurred. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the college in independently administered funds.

#### i) Government grants:

Government grants are recognized in the balance sheet initially when there is reasonable assurance that they will be received and that the college will comply with the conditions attaching to them. Grants that compensate the college for expenses incurred are recognized as revenue in the statement of comprehensive income on a systematic basis in the same periods in which the expenses are incurred. Grants that compensate the college for the cost of an asset are deducted in arriving at the carrying amount of the asset and consequently are recognized in the statement of comprehensive income over the useful life of the asset.

### 4. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

#### 4A. CATEGORIES OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The carrying amount of financial assets is HK\$4,838,896 (2012: HK\$3,920,017) which is represented by cash and bank balance in the balance sheet.

The carrying amount of financial liabilities at amortised cost is HK\$6,800 (2012: HK\$7,270) which is represented by the accrued expenses in the balance sheet.

#### 4B. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The main risks arising from the college's financial instruments are interest rate risk, credit risk, liquidity risk and foreign exchange risk. The college does not have any written risk management policies and guidelines. However, the board of councillors meet periodically to analyze and formulate measures to manage the college's exposure to these risks. Generally, the college introduces conservative strategies on its risk management. As the college's exposure to these risks is kept to a minimum, the college has not used any derivatives and other instruments for hedging purposes. The councillors review and agree policies for managing each of these risks and they are summarized as follows:

##### a) Interest rate risk

The college has interest-bearing bank deposits and no interest-bearing liabilities. The councillors consider that the interest rate risk is not significant.

b) Credit risk

The college is exposed to credit risk, which is the risk that a counterparty will be unable to pay amounts in full when due. The company's maximum exposure to credit risk in the event of the counterparties failure to perform their obligations as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2013 in relation to each class of recognised financial assets equal to the carrying amounts of those assets as stated in the balance sheet. The company's credit risk are monitored on an ongoing basis.

The credit risk on liquid funds is limited because the counterparties are banks with high reputation.

c) Liquidity risk

Please refer to page 15.

d) Foreign exchange risk

The college carries out its activities in Hong Kong and most of the transactions are denominated in Hong Kong Dollars. Accordingly, the councillors of the college consider the college's foreign exchange risk to be insignificant.

e) Fair value estimation

The college's financial assets and financial liabilities have their carrying amounts approximately equal to their fair values due to their immediate and short-term maturities.

c) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that funds will not be available to meet liabilities as they fall due, and it results from amount and maturity mismatches of assets and liabilities.

Prudent liquidity risk management implies maintaining sufficient bank balances.

The following table details the remaining contractual maturities at the balance sheet date of the college's financial liabilities which are based on contractual undiscounted cash flows and the earliest date the college can be required to pay.
