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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is less than one year since I was granted the privilege of assuming the Presidency of the College and the first year of any new responsibilities anyone undertakes always poses particular challenges.

I am sure that the Council of the College would wish me to express its gratitude to the first President of the College, Professor S.H.Y. Wei, who had indicated his wish to step-down from the presidency in October 1995, for his guidance of College affairs since he became President at the first meeting of the Council held on 31 May 1993. Professor Wei continues to serve on the College Council, so we have access to the experience he gained as President, and I have also the enormous benefits of two very able Vice-Presidents in Professor H. Tideman and Dr. K.H. Lee, to both of whom I am deeply grateful for their efforts on behalf of the College.

Councillors have been much occupied in refining the College's Committee Structure, with clearly defined powers and duties for its constituent committees and subcommittees. To all who have contributed their time chairing these bodies, I extend my grateful thanks.

The work of the Education Committee has been particularly onerous and Professor Tideman has shouldered the burden of chairing it with great skill and determination. The training pathways and supporting infrastructure have now been laid down for Orthodontics, Paediatric Dentistry, Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and Restorative Dentistry. Dr. K.H. Lee has also expended a great deal of effort with his Subcommittee in ensuring that the College's Continuing Education Programme has been accepted by the Academy.

I chaired an Open Forum for Fellows of the College on Continuing Medical Education (CME) on 5 June 1996. Colleges within the Academy are obviously intimately involved in the Academy's statutory obligation to support CME for all Fellows. While there are a number of areas of concern about meeting the requirements on the part of Fellows, the College has indicated that it is prepared to be reactive and flexible to the difficulties which may arise in the early period of implementation. Dr. Lee will shortly be promulgating details of the College programmes and the date of the commencement of the first cycle of CME.

Scientific meetings and specialist teaching sessions are thus clearly going to be even more important for the College to support and sponsor with the advent of definitive CME requirements. In this regard the success of the 3rd Annual Scientific Meeting organised by Professor I. Barnes and his Scientific Meeting Committee is a particular pleasure to report, and the College is very much indebted to them for their major role in that success.

Another success which I take great delight in reporting is the very smooth running of the first examination venture of the College - the Conjoint Examination embracing the M.Orth of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh and the Intermediate Examination for the Fellowship in Orthodontics of this College. The distinguished panel of external examiners had nothing but praise for the organisation of the examinations; praise which quite rightly falls at the door of our Secretary, Dr. John Ling, in conjunction with a number of his colleagues from the sphere of Orthodontics here in Hong Kong.

We were graced by the presence in Hong Kong, at the time of the Conjoint Examination, of Professor Nairn Wilson, Dean of the Faculty of Dental Surgery of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. It is clear there is ample scope for future collaboration over examinations in other disciplines, and this your Council will be actively exploring. We shall also be working towards inclusion of higher qualifications in General Dental Practice in the College's remit. Preliminary informal discussions indicate that this would be seen internationally as a proper and legitimate development for the College to consider given its essential mission to maintain the highest professional standards.

It was especially significant that one successful candidate in that Conjoint examination was from the People's Republic of China - the first in fact to sit such an examination. This must augur well for the role of our College in the Region in the years ahead as does the invitation I have received, as President, to attend the Inaugural Meeting of the Chinese Stomatological Association.

I extend my deep thanks to all the members of the College Council who have given so much to the development of the College in this exciting first year of my Presidency. Much work lies ahead in these challenging times. The College is yours. It belongs to the Fellows, and we must all share its abiding commitment to quality specialist oral health care for our patients in Hong Kong. It would be equally apposite that the College develop the same commitment towards general oral health care and provide for appropriate higher training in this sphere which would have international accreditation. Doubtless there will be more on these matters and others which will have been considered by your Council in the significant year which lies ahead of us.

DENTAL SPECIALIST MANPOWER PLANNING COMMITTEE

At the 28th Council meeting of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong on October 30, 1995, it was resolved that a committee should be established to look into the dental specialist manpower situation in Hong Kong. Drs. Christopher Holmgren and Lillian Low were appointed as co-chairpersons of this committee thereafter to be referred to as the Dental Specialist Manpower Planning Committee (DSMPC).

Realising that additional expertise was required in order to fulfill the tasks of the committee, two more Fellows with experience in the field of manpower planning, namely Drs. Elizabeth Kwan and Edward Lo, were co-opted onto the committee. The membership was formally approved by Council on December 13, 1995.

Subsequently, members of the DSMPC have met five times throughout the year to execute the responsibility bestowed upon them.

The first task undertaken was to formulate appropriate terms of reference for this committee. As a result, the following was presented to the council for endorsement :

- to determine the present number, types and employment status of dental specialists in Hong Kong, and
- to make projections of the future requirements for dental specialists for the years 2000 and 2005.

The second task was to define the term "specialist" as applied to the Hong Kong situation since there was no universally agreed definition. The third was the gathering of statistics from various sources so as to identify the situation with regard to the present specialist manpower both in Hong Kong and in other countries in South East Asia. The fourth and by far the most difficult task was to analyse the statistics collected and to make a sensible forecast of the manpower need for Hong Kong for the years ahead. It would be pertinent to stress here that the forecast can only be taken as an educated estimate since the accuracy will depend on many factors some of which have tremendous bearing as 1997 approaches.

The DSMPC are pleased to report that the draft report on the dental specialist manpower issue is now nearing completion and will be presented to Council for consideration shortly.

EDUCATION & EXAMINATIONS COMMITTEE

During the year 1995-1996, the following issues were discussed:

- Sub Committees on Accreditation and Training in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Orthodontics, Paediatrics and Restorative were established.
- Guidelines for the accreditation and training in the 4 specialities were accepted by the Council of the College of Dental Surgeons and by the Education Committee of the Academy of Medicine.
- Recognition of Training Units, Trainers and Supervisors in basic and advanced training were accepted by Council for the following specialities:
Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery,
Orthodontics,
Paediatric Dentistry
- Principles and Guidelines on Continuing Medical Education were discussed at length and accepted by Council of the College and by the Education Committee of the Academy.
- In view of the enormous amount of work to be done on CME a special sub-committee was established under the Chairmanship of Dr. R. Lee with the Chairman of the Education Committee as an ex-officio member.
- A Dental Specialist Manpower Planning Committee was established and introduced and terms of reference approved and this Committee will advise the Council of the College and the Education Committee of the Academy of Medicine via the Chairman of the Education Committee.
- Orthodontics: Conjoint Examination FHKAM (Intermediate) HK and M.Orth. RCSED, with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh was accepted.
- Panel of Local Examiners for Conjoint Examination approved.
- The Chairman of the Education Committee represents the College of Dental Surgeons in the Education Committee of the Academy of Medicine.

- The Education Committee of the Academy meets every month and the following points were discussed:-

- Approval of accreditation and training and approval of training units of 13 colleges
- Admission criteria of College Fellows
- Admission criteria of Academy Fellows
- Approval of Continuing Medical Education for 13 Colleges
- List of Internationally Recognised Overseas Higher Qualifications
- Recognised Overseas Higher Qualifications Obtained by Exit Examinations
- Guidelines for Recognition/Formation of New Academy Colleges/Faculties
- Guidelines for Recognition and Visitation of Overseas Training Units for Specialists

CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION SUBCOMMITTEE

The purpose of Continuing Medical Education (CME) is to keep Fellows informed and up-to-date, and to maintain a high standard of professional practice. The Hong Kong Academy of Medicine had asked each constituent College to implement a CME programme that is appropriate to its Fellows.

Terms of Reference :

1. To implement, monitor and evaluate CME
2. To scrutinise and approve meetings, conferences, seminars, workshop and other educational activities suitable for accreditation
3. To capture information on CME undertaken by each Fellow
4. To provide feedback to Fellows on their performance

A document 'Principles and Guidelines on Continuing Medical Education' was produced and sent out to all our Fellows in May 1996. An Open Forum was held on 5 June 1996 to introduce the CME programme. There were many useful exchanges at the Forum. As a result, two amendments were made to the Document in relation to the maximum points for self-study and for chairing in a meeting. The Document and the subsequent amendments had been approved by the Academy.

A total of four meetings were held and many issues related to CME were discussed in depth. It was decided that the first 3-year cycle of our CME programme shall commence on 1 January 1997.

The following papers were also promulgated to facilitate CME activities for our Fellows :

1. List of Journals approved for self-study
2. Categories of organisations whose scientific activities had been pre-approved for the purpose of awarding CME points
3. Claim forms for the various CME activities namely self-study, passive participation, active participation, publications, quality assurance and other College and Academy activities

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

1. Applications for Membership of the College and Fellowship of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine.

15 such applications are under consideration. Details and a written testimony of training are still being sought for some of these applications.

2. Status of Fellows of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong.

Currently there are two Fellows of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong who have not been accepted as Fellows of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. There is one further applicant who has been refused admission by the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. This case is to be presented to the Council of the College of Dental Surgeons for appeal to the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine.

The Chairman has been working on a discussion paper for the Committee on the status of dentists with suitable postgraduate qualifications but without have followed an appropriate Three-plus-Three training pathway (or equivalent). On application to the College these could be admitted either as

- (i) Ordinary Members of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong (and only to admit them as Fellows of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong when remedial training, if possible, could make them eligible for admission as Fellow of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (Dental Surgery)).
- (ii) Fellow of the Hong Kong College of Dental Surgeons (and not propose them for admission to the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine as Fellow of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (Dental Surgery)).

Following discussions with members of the Membership Committee and Officers and Councillors of the Council of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong this discussion paper is being expanded to included proposals for Council on the handling of dentists with higher qualifications in General Dental Practice who may apply to the College for consideration for admission. The proposals will be brought to a future Council Meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mr. President, Fellow Members :

It is my pleasure to give you the Treasurer's Report for 1995-96. The account was audited by Messrs Li Tang Chen & Co., Certified Public Accountant. On the balance sheet, you may have noticed a deficit, it is mainly because the amount from Members' subscriptions is carried over to the next fiscal year. Otherwise I am happy to report that the financial status of our College is very healthy. There are HK\$271,554.23 in the savings account and HK\$32,445.95 in the current account. As of last count, our College has 121 paid-up Members and 3 Honorary Members.

Our major source of income was from Members' subscriptions. Interest from the savings account deposit yielded HK\$13,231.10 for this year.

Major expenditure items for this year were the purchase of 21 College gowns and the printing of College letter sheets. The 2nd Annual Scientific Meeting also incurred a spending of HK\$26,590. In the coming year, I can envisage some expenditure will be necessary for examinations and Continued Medical Education programmes.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank Messrs Li Tang Chen & Co., our Honorary Auditor for auditing the account. Special thanks should also go to my predecessor Dr. John Ling who held the account jointly with me until this December and has given me much invaluable help.
