PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This is the second occasion on which I have had the privilege of reporting to the College as its President. As always, I am enormously grateful to all the members of the College Council for their efforts in managing the growth and development of the College. Most especially I would wish to acknowledge the work of the Officers of the College, some of whom have shouldered onerous administrative burdens on behalf of the Council .

We have missed the wise counsel of Erik Peake as Honorary Administrative Adviser since his retirement from his position at the Prince Philip Dental Hospital in March 1997. It is particularly gratifying for me to be in a position to mark the debt of gratitude the College owes to Erik Peake, following the unanimous approval of Council of the award of an Honorary Fellowship of the College to Mr. Peake. This will be the first occasion for the College to honour the life and work of the College of someone from outwith the dental profession itself.

The work of the Council has continued unabated throughout the year and we have been most ably supported by our new Secretary, Michael Chau, in fulfilling our duties. I am conscious of the responsibilities that have fallen upon the shoulders of my two Vice Presidents, Urban Hägg and Roch Lee in making progress on the education front. Roch Lee and his Subcommittee now have the Continuing Medical Education element of the College's duties well established, while acknowledging that refinements of procedures will always be necessary as we learn more about the implementation of the system.

A major development within Urban Hägg's Education and Examinations Committee is the inclusion of higher examination in General Dental Practice in the remit of the College. Such a move has not been without concern, both within and without the College. However, it is entirely consistent with the objects of the College, and is certainly, as Fellows of other Colleges will be aware, mirrored in many sister institutions overseas. At the kernel of the issue is necessarily the matter of standards, and the expectation must always be that qualifications granted within the field of General Dental Practice are placed at a level which matches those on the international scene. Once again, as in our specialist examinations, we have been aided in establishing the international credibility of the higher qualifications we are implementing within our College, by co-operating in conjoint examination processes with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh.

I congratulate all those involved, together with their counterparts from the Royal College in Edinburgh, in ensuring that the Conjoint Examinations in Orthodontics are now becoming established within the region. It was very pleasing to be able to congratulate personally the successful candidates in the company of Professor Nairn Wilson, Dean of the Dental Faculty at the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, who visited Hong Kong at the time of a recent diet of the examinations in Orthodontics.

The success of the orthodontic examinations has spurred on the work of the other specialist subcommittees. The Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery examinations are well ahead in their planning, and I know Council seeks to have all the other specialty conjoint examinations established in 1998.

With developments over Bylaw 16 within the Academy of Medicine, it is clear that there is now a growing imperative for the College to define and institute its own exit examination following the completion of Specialist Training. I have no doubt this will occupy the deliberations of the Education and Examinations Committee in 1998.

It is pleasing, as 1997 draws to a close, with all the excitement of the 'history-in-the-making' which has taken place in Hong Kong, to report to you the steady development and maturation of your College. The membership structure and terms of reference of the various Committees and Subcommittees over which I initiated a review at the start of my presidency are now being completed. The Treasurer has the College's funds in a healthy state, and I want to thank David Lau, as he leaves Council, for all his consistently supportive efforts on the financial front. He rightly points out that there are a number of matters before us in 1998 which will draw on our relatively small reserves. I hope that the College can look to all Fellows in future to assist it in maintaining the standards which we have now established for higher training in our profession, be this in contributing financially to the College, or contributing in administrative effort.

I look forward to meeting as many Fellows as I can at the forthcoming Scientific Meeting and to having your input into the future growth of the College.

EDUCATION & EXAMINATIONS COMMITTEE

Subcommittee on Accreditation and Training in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery

The key issues in the agenda for 1997 are accreditation and examination.

- The Subcommittee has received applications for accreditation from University and Government Oral & Surgery Training Programmes. The Subcommittee is satisfied that both Programmes fulfil the Guideline for accreditation as stipulated by the College, and they are recommended to the Education Committee for accreditation accordingly. The Training protocol follows the "3+3" pathway as recommended by the College. A standard Record of Surgical Training (Log book) has also been adopted by both Training Programmes
- The inaugural Intermediate Examination in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery is scheduled to be held in late 1998. The Subcommittee has agreed in principle that the Intermediate Examination will be conjoint with the Membership in Oral Surgery Examination (MOSRCSEd), to be organised with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. Preliminary discussion with the Edinburgh College is encouraging, and ground work for the Conjoint Examination is in good progress.

CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION SUBCOMMITTEE

1. CME Sub-committee Meetings :

Total number of Sub-committee meetings during the year 1997 = 5

2. Status of Fellows with respect to CME Activity :

No. of Fellows starting the 1st cycle of CME activity on 1st January, 1997 = 122

No. of Fellows starting the 1st cycle of CME activity on 1st July, 1997 = 5

No. of Fellows starting the 1st cycle of CME activity on 1st July, 1998 = 4

3. Application for CME points :

A total of 20 out of the 122 Fellows (16.4%) have submitted CME applications and their applications have been considered and endorsed by our CME Sub-committee. The following table is a summary of the CME scores :

Remarks :

The highest no. of CME points scored by a Fellow is 165.25. A total of 7 Fellows have scored 30 or more CME points during this first cycle so far.

4. Accreditation of CME Activities :

A total of 102 dentally-related and 19 non-dentally related scientific meetings, either locally or overseas, have been considered and approved by our CME Sub-committee for the accreditation of CME points.

Out of all activities, 54 of them being passive participation and 21 of them being active participation. A total of 9 "publications" were endorsed for CME points and a total of 20 articles were submitted for accreditation under "Self-study".

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mr. President, Fellow Members:

It is my pleasure to give you the Treasurer's Report for 1996-97. The account was audited by Messrs Li Tang Chen & Co., Certified Public Accountant and was adopted in the last Council Meeting. This year, we have noted a net surplus of HK\$70,902. On the balance sheet, the College has HK\$376,878.36 in the bank. As of last count, we have a total of 132 Full Members and 4 Honorary Members.

Our major source of income was from Members' subscriptions. Another major income for this financial year was the highly successful 3rd Annual Scientific Meeting with a surplus of HK\$39,903.62. Interest from the savings account deposit yielded HK\$10,344.03.

Major expenditure for this year were the 1st diet of the Conjoint Examination in Orthodontics with The Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh and the 3rd Annual General Meeting dinner party. In the coming year, I can envisage some expenditure will be necessary in holding examinations for the other specialties. Reserve should also be set aside for the furnishings of the College Chamber at the Academy Building.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank Messrs Li Tang Chen & Co., our Honorary Auditor for auditing the account and to all my colleagues at the College Council.
