PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is my first duty to express my gratitude to the Fellows for my third year in office as President. Each succeeding year in the College seems to have resulted in more challenges and opportunities for continued development.

This year is obviously a very significant one for the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine and it is pleasing that our Scientific Meeting and our Annual General Meeting take place virtually coincident with the First International Congress of the Academy. Those who have been involved in the affairs of the College from its inception will know that our status as a constituent founding College of the Academy was by no means straightforward. The effort that was expended at that time came to fruition and it is most fit and proper that the profession from which we come is very much a part of Hong Kong's most senior specialist organisation covering all the Health Disciplines.

The opening of the Academy Building has now provided access to our new College chambers. I would wish to place on record the College's gratitude to Dr. Roch Lee for having overseen the refurbishment of this room which I hope you will find most suitable and elegant. As I said in my appeal for sponsorship of the internal decoration, the Chamber is the image which the College presents to visitors of all kinds, so I thank those twenty-eight Fellows who have contributed to the fund.

A notable event in the year has been the further development of the Conjoint Examinations with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. On this occasion specialties which have joined the list are Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and Paediatric Dentistry. We continue to be deeply appreciative of the liaison with the Edinburgh College over these examinations and also those concerned with General Dental Practice. A major task which lies ahead is the final structure of our Exit Examination, demands for which are likely to be upon us sooner than we expect.

The need for the establishment of our Exit Examination is pressing because of the Academy's rescission of By-law 16 - effectively the 'grandfather' clause set up at the institution of the Academy. This has focused the minds of our Education Committee and our Membership Committee and I thank them, especially their Chairmen, Professor Hägg and Dr. Ling, for the extra work that has been involved in implementing our procedures so that eligible candidates could be presented for Fellowship by the deadline set by the Academy. This process has also been without its inherent problems, but I am confident that Committee Members and Officers have treated all applicants in a completely equitable fashion which must be of great importance for the standing and credibility of our College. One most pleasant outcome is the fact that we shall be admitting thirty-four Fellows today which brings our total College membership to 156.

Although it will be left to others to cite their achievements, I must express my personal satisfaction and pleasure upon the two Honorary Fellowships that will be awarded today. One in some senses, acknowledges the professional roots we have in the British traditions, and the other reinforces our ongoing role in the People's Republic of China of which we are now a part. I am also pleased to welcome our other Honorary Fellows who are present,

from Shanghai and Guangzhou. It is always a delight to welcome them back to our midst and to remind ourselves of our mission to maintain the closest possible collaboration with our sister specialties in the Mainland.

At the Diploma Award Ceremony of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh earlier this month, I was able to witness the award of Fellowships to two of our colleagues who have played an important part in our development. Professor Henk Tideman received the Fellowship in Dental Surgery *ad hominem* and Dr. Tak Chow, who continues to serve on Council, was awarded the Fellowship without examination. The College of Dental Surgeons participated in this Ceremony together with our sister colleges of Surgery and of Otorhinolaryngology and that, too, was an indication of the ties which bind the constituent colleges in the Academy of Medicine.

I would extend my sincere gratitude to all Members of the College Council who have contributed to our deliberations and our decision-making over the year. I particularly thank those who have gone on to give generously of their time to implement College policies. I would wish to mention Dr. Michael Chau, our Secretary, for he has the task of liaising between the Council and myself, and when the President is not always available at just the right time, life for a Secretary can be rather fraught. Dr. Chau has coped splendidly and deserves our admiration for the quiet efficiency with which he fulfils his duty. As new elections will bring in new blood and new ideas to the Council, a process which I regard as of great importance in my organisation, I bid farewell to members leaving the Council. They leave with our thanks and our very best wishes.

I cannot emphasise strongly enough how vital it is that all Fellows feel a part of the whole organisation. The Council expends much effort on your behalf, but it is your College, it is your support, it is your involvement which will ultimately dictate our success. I believe the College has the right to look to all Fellows for such support if we are to adhere to our primary purpose of continuously extending and enhancing clinical practice in the Dental Specialties so as to serve the community in Hong Kong.

The Education Committee (EC) meets once a month the week before the Council Meeting and two weeks prior to the monthly meeting of the Education Committee of Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. The EC consists of the Chairmen of the Sub-Committees on Accreditation and Training in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Orthodontics, Paediatric Dentistry and Restorative Dentistry. Following the approval of three specialties in dentistry (Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Orthodontics and Paediatric Dentistry) by the HKAM Education Committee in July 1998, the name of the respective Sub-Committee on Accreditation and Training was changed to "Specialty Board" of the discipline. The "Approval" included definition of the specialty, justification of the specialty, approval of Supervisor/s, Trainers and Training Centres, and an update of the Training Pathways approved in 1994. Since the HKAM decided to recognise specialties only and not subspecialties, Restorative Dentistry as a specialty comprising a number of subspecialties could not be justified. In September the Sub-Committee on Restorative Dentistry was dissolved, and four representatives representing four potential specialties were co-opted to the Education Committee for a period up to 6 months, and have started their work in October 1998.

The EC

- Endorsed the specialties in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Orthodontics and Paediatric Dentistry (Description, Justification, approval of Supervisor/s, Trainers, Training Centres and an up-date of Training Pathways) – (Approved by HKAM).

- Listed Fellows who are specialists in the three approved specialties.
- Listed Trainees in the three approved specialties were given log books.
- Defined the additional training and signed contracts with potential fellows to be admitted under By-law 16 (5 potential fellows in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and 4 in Orthodontics; the remedial training and supervisors for the 16 potential fellows from the Restorative sector are to be finalised when the “new” specialties have been approved).
- Started to prepare for other potential specialties from the former Restorative sector.
- Revised and endorsed a list of recognised qualifications, which is in effect from October 1, 1998 (Approved by HKAM)

EXAMINATIONS

- ♦ MGDS Examinations were held in May and November 1998.
- ♦ The Conjoint Examination in Paediatric Dentistry was held in November 1998 (Intermediate Examination)
- ♦ The Conjoint Examination in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery was held in November 1998 (Intermediate Examination)
- ♦ The Conjoint Intermediate Examination and the Exit Examination in Orthodontics are planned for November 1999.

1. Specialty Board in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery

The key issues for 1997-98 were accreditation and examination.

- The Specialty Board in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery (SBOMS) had received an application for accreditation from the United Christian Hospital (UCH) Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery Network of the Hospital Authority Training Programme. The SBOMS was satisfied with the UCH Training Programme after a visitation and has recommended to the Education Committee for accreditation accordingly. Visitation had also been conducted by representatives from the Education Committee to the University and Government Training Institutes in April and continuous accreditation of both programmes was endorsed.
- The SBOMS had endorsed that the Intermediate Examination be a conjoint examination with the Membership in Oral Surgery Examination (MOS RCSEd) held by the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. The inaugural Intermediate Examination in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery was held from 17-20 November 1998. In this inaugural diet, Professor H Tideman was appointed as Chief Examiner from CDSHK, supported by Dr. K K Chau and Dr. N Sammon, with Dr. S W Yan as Observer. The Examiners from Edinburgh were Professor J Cowpe and Mr. G E Lello. A total of five candidates took part in the Conjoint Examination. The following candidates were successful:

2. Specialty Board in Orthodontics

- The Orthodontic Department of Prince Philip Dental Hospital (Faculty of Dentistry, University of Hong Kong), Yaumatei Jockey Club and Central Government Offices Dental Clinics (Department of Health) were recognised as training units for Orthodontics.
- Four trainees in the higher training programme were expected to complete their additional training in order to fulfil requirements for Fellowships of the College and Academy of Medicine under By-law 16. The registrants will sit for an exit assessment after the additional training.
- A total of 9 trainees in Basic training of the pathway were expected to sit for the Conjoint MOrth RCSEd / FCDSHK (Intermediate) Examination in Orthodontics in 1999.

3. Specialty Board in Paediatric Dentistry

During the year 1997-1998 the following issues were discussed:

- There was much dialogue with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh resulting in the first Conjoint Examination in Paediatric Dentistry between our College and the Edinburgh College. This examination was held from 17-20 November 1998 with four candidates participating.
- The Specialty Board has made submission through the College to the Academy of Medicine to recognise Paediatric Dentistry as a specialty in the Academy.
- The Specialty Board has considered and recommended to the College and the Academy of Medicine a list of internationally recognised higher qualifications.
- The Specialty Board has requested all trainees to complete their registration with the Board.

4. Subcommittee on Accreditation and Training in Restorative Dentistry (SATRD) (December 1997 - September 1998)

Chairmanship of SATRD passed from Dr. Chow Tak Wah to Dr. Esmonde Corbet early in the period of this report. The SATRD considered the cases of 15 applicants for admission as Fellow under By-law 16. Ten of these are considered to be trainees and appropriate follow-up action is being taken to ensure that these 10 trainees agree to the further higher training requirements and the deadlines.

By mutual agreement of "Restorative Fellows", the SATRD was disestablished in September 1998. *Ad hoc* Groups were formed to deal with the following disciplines previously administered by the SATRD:

- Endodontics
- Periodontology
- Prosthodontics
- Public Dental Health

These *ad hoc* groups were charged with developing proposals on the recognition of individual specialties, on trainers, supervisors and training centres, and on training pathways for submission to the Education and Examinations Committee of the College.

***Ad hoc* Group in Prosthodontics**

The *Ad hoc* group in Prosthodontics was formed in October 1998 after the disestablishment of the Subcommittee on Accreditation and Training in Restorative Dentistry. Proposal for recognition of Prosthodontics as a specialty of Dentistry was submitted to the Education Committee. Potential supervisors, trainers and trainees were identified and a list of these was also submitted. The training pathway in Prosthodontics is being developed and a proposal will be submitted to the Education Committee in December 1998.

***Ad hoc* Group in Endodontics**

The Group, after discussions, agreed to apply for recognition as a specialty in the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. Draft documents were submitted and debated at the Education Committee of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong.

The proposal was turned down because of an absence of a dedicated Master's degree in the specialty, although a number of candidates are undergoing a curriculum purely in Endodontics. The Group will consider re-applying for recognition as a specialty in the future.

5. Subcommittee on Education and Examinations for GDP (SEEGDP)

During the past 12 months, the SEEGDP met on numerous occasions. The Subcommittee organized three examinations and postgraduate courses for candidates preparing for the Conjoint Membership of General Dental Surgery (MGDS).

A 3-day course was held 19-21 January with speakers from The Royal College of Edinburgh. The Part I MGDS Examination was held on 13-15 May with 19 candidates. Fourteen candidates passed the examination.

Postgraduate seminars were given regularly from May to October by lecturers from various specialties. MGDS holders shared their experience with the candidates and provided much support.

Two candidates applied to re-sit the Part I of the MGDS examination with 12 candidates entered for the Part II of the examination. The written component and oral component of Part I together with the surgery visitation and clinical examination of Part II were held during the week beginning 16 November 1998. Examiners from the United Kingdom, China, Hong Kong and Singapore were appointed.

The Subcommittee is currently considering the requirements of a training pathway for higher qualifications in General Dental Practice in Hong Kong and shall submit a proposal to the Education Committee in due course.

The Subcommittee thanks the Education Committee and the Council of The College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong for their support.

(ii) The First CME Cycle :

The first three-year cycle started on 1st January 1997. Thereafter new Fellows commenced their respective CME cycle on either 1st July of the same year or 1st January of the subsequent year, whichever date is the next nearest. The date of commencement was recorded for each and every Fellow. Our College required a minimum of 90 CME credits over the three-year cycle.

(iii) Status of Eligible and Active Fellows with respect to CME Activities :

(iv) Accreditation of CME points :

Out of the 115 Fellows who started the cycle on 1.1.97, a total of 74 of them (64.3%) have registered their CME activities with our Sub-Committee. The following table is a summary of their CME scores :

Remarks : A total of 37 Fellows (32.17%) have scored 60 or more CME credits, meeting the required credits up to the end of the second year of the three-year cycle. Out of which the highest no. of CME credits scored by a Fellow is 357.5 points.

(v) "Handbook on Continuing Medical Education" and "Personal Diary for CME Points"

The number of Fellows having no CME scores registered with our CME Sub-committee is still considered to be high. In our opinion, these Fellows failed or forgot to send in their CME application rather than scoring no CME points at all.

For the purpose of reminding and encouraging all Fellows to submit their CME applications promptly, our CME Sub-committee has designed two booklets, "*Handbook on Continuing Medical Education*" and "*Personal Diary for CME Points*", to be sent to all Fellows. These booklets should be ready for dispatch by the time Fellows are reading this report.

7. Organizing Committee of the First International Congress of HKAM

The representative of the College of Dental Surgeons in the Organizing Committee (OC) is Professor Urban Hägg. The Co-Chairmen of OC are the President of HKAM Dr. David Fang and Dr. C. H. Leong. A number of themes for symposiums were listed by the Organizing Committee and the 15 Colleges were invited to propose topics and speakers. The College of Dental Surgeons listed a number of topics/speakers out of which two were accepted - Trauma (Dr. Jens Andreasen, Denmark) and Congenital Anomalies (Professor Nigel King, HKU). A full-day satellite symposium on "Recent Advances in Traumatic Injuries" by Dr. Jens Andreasen has also been organized on Sunday November 29, 1998, open also for students and non-members (the arrangement has been finalized together with the Scientific Meetings Committee of the College and its Chairman, Dr. Joseph Chan). A number of abstracts had been submitted by the Fellows and vetted by three senior academic Fellows.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

During this year, the Membership Committee held three meetings. Sixty-two applicants were individually screened and 34 applicants were submitted to Council for endorsement and admission as Fellows of the College. Thirty-nine applicants applied for the Academy Fellowship via the College under By-law 16, 36 applicants being successful and 3 applicants were advised to undergo additional training. All unsuccessful applicants for admission under By-law 16 were notified. As the deadline for admission under By-law 16 has already lapsed, all potential Fellows will be considered as trainees, and they shall contact the respective Specialty Boards or Sub-Committees on Accreditation and Training, in their particular dental disciplines, of the Education and Examinations Committee for the training pathway.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The accounts of our College were audited by Messrs. Li Tang Chan & Co., Certified Public Accountant and were adopted by the College Council on 18th November 1998. For the year ended 31st March 1998, our College has a net surplus of HK\$212, 757. On the balance sheet, we have HK\$597,469 in the bank.
