## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

First of all I would like to thank all councillors and committee members for their tireless efforts to fulfill the tasks and the goals for our College. I also thank all fellows for their support.

The Conjoint Examinations with the Royal College in Edinburgh are running very smoothly, and at this stage comprises of four examinations: Intermediate Examination/Membership in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Orthodontics and Paediatric Dentistry respectively and Membership in General Dental Surgery. It is my sincere hope that the collaboration with the Royal College of Edinburgh can be extended to the restorative field, once the training pathway for the specialties in various field of adult dentistry have been established. It is indeed a disappointment that the training pathway for those specialties have not been finalized yet, but my hope is that there will be good news on this issue in your President's next report.

The vocational training of General Dental Practitioners has been approved. After successfully completing the training the candidates can be admitted as Fellows of the College of Dental Surgeons, but not of the Academy.

The first CME cycle has been successfully completed by practically all fellows. To further facilitate for the fellows to get the required CME points, the College has increased its own involvement in arranging continuous educational activities, by adding a Scientific

Spring Event to the scientific programme at the AGM held in the fall. The new spring event held in HKAM Building in mid-May attracted more than 200 participants. A special thank to our own fellows who willingly contributed to the programme together with the overseas speaker Dr Andersson. The College is contributing to the programme of the Second International Congress of the HKAM by providing five locals and one overseas speaker. On Sunday November 5<sup>th</sup>, we have the pleasure to have one of the world's most gifted clinician sharing his expertise and experience in the area of ultra thin veneers, which is common treatment option for many of our patients here in Hong Kong.

It seems that the College goes from strength to strength. The service to its fellow has improved by offering more activities, and by adding a full-time secretary, Miss Ada Houn, to ensure efficient service.

I wish the College a successful year to come. It has been a privilege to serve you during the past years.

1. The Committee had three meetings during the year to receive reports from the Specialty Boards of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (OMFS), Orthodontics and Paediatric Dentistry; as well as the CME and GDP Sub-committees.
2. Examination plans of specialties for this year and up to 2003 were being worked out. This year there will be Conjoint Examinations with the Edinburgh College in OMFS and MGDS in November.
3. Submissions for new specialties were received from Prosthodontics, Periodontics and Endodontics. Drs William Yung, Gordon Chiu and Gary Cheung were invited to attend the EC meetings. Their respective Guideline for Accreditation and Training as well as Application for Training Institute Status are being discussed with a view to submit to the College Council and the Academy for endorsement by the end of the year.
4. The First CME Cycle report of the College was submitted and endorsed by the Academy.
5. Application for approval of the new dental unit at Nethersole Hospital at Tai Po as a training centre for Vocational Training of GDP was received.
6. Trainees were asked to register with the College. As from the year 2001, basic trainee will have to pay HK\$500 as annual fee, and higher trainees after the passing of intermediate examination will have to pay HK\$3000 as admission fee and HK\$1000 as annual fee.

- ✧ No Conjoint Examination was conducted in 1999. The Second diet of Conjoint Examination with the Membership in Oral surgery of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh is scheduled to be held on the week commencing 27<sup>th</sup> November 2000. Professor H Tideman is appointed to be the Chief Examiner in this diet.
- ✧ Two Higher trainees were accepting their additional training in order to fulfill requirements for Fellowship of the College and Academy under By-law 16. The Exit Assessment in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery is scheduled to be held in March 2001.
- ✧ The examination schedule for the Specialty of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery for the next three years has been formulated. The inaugural diet of Exit Examination is scheduled to be held in November 2001.

## **2. Specialty Board in Orthodontics**

During the year 1999-2000 the following issues were discussed and dealt with:

- ✧ The third Conjoint Membership Examination in Orthodontics with our sister College the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh was held from 22<sup>nd</sup> November to 27<sup>th</sup> November 1999. Three out of six candidates passed Section A and all 13 candidates passed Section B of the examination. The candidates came from Hong Kong, Australia, Japan and Singapore.
- ✧ The MOrth Medal in Hong Kong was awarded to Dr. Ricky WONG Wing Kit, being the best performing candidate in the 1999 diet of examination
- ✧ The specialty board have requested all trainees to complete their registration with the board and to take appropriate examinations and clinical training.
- ✧ The specialty board will be conducting an Exit Assessment at the end of the year 2000.



- ✧ Exit examination will be scheduled for those trainees who have completed their higher training in 2001.
- ✧ A Conjoint examination of Section A MOrth with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh is scheduled on 4-5 December 2000.
- ✧ Conjoint Section B MOrthRCSEd/Intermediate FCDSHK examination in Orthodontics has been scheduled in November 2001 and 2002.

### **3. Specialty Board in Paediatric Dentistry**

The following issues were discussed and dealt with during the year 1999-2000.

- ✧ The second Conjoint Examination in Paediatric Dentistry with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh was held in November. There were five candidates sitting for the Part I examination and there were two candidates sitting for the Part II examination. All candidates were successful.
- ✧ The 1<sup>st</sup> Exit Assessment in Paediatric Dentistry was held on 27<sup>th</sup> March 2000. The only candidate Dr CHAN Chi Lap, Samuel was successful and is admitted as a fellow in the specialty of Paediatric Dentistry.
- ✧ The Specialty Board processed and approved one application for higher training in Australia.
- ✧ The Specialty Board conducted a site visit of one dental practice for approval as suitable for higher training.
- ✧ The President and Vice President of the Hong Kong Society of Paediatric Dentistry were invited to be members of the Specialty Board.

#### **4. Subcommittee on Education and Examinations for General Dental Practitioners (SEEGDP)**

The Vocation Training Pathway in Primary Dental Care has now been in place for 18 months. Three examinations of Membership in General Dental Surgery had been held in Hong Kong. There are now 16 local dentists who obtained their MGDS qualification in Hong Kong.

Announcements of the MGDS examination were sent to all general practitioners on the Dentists List published by the Hong Kong Government and promulgated in the Newsletter of the Hong Kong Dental Association. The SEEGDP held an orientation seminar in April 2000 to advise general dental practitioners on the requirements and preparation for the MGDS examinations. 13 candidates were registered for the Part I of the examination and another 7 were registered for the Part II.

The Subcommittee organised regular revision seminars for the Part I candidates to cover the relevant topics as extensively as possible. Joint seminars were also organised in collaboration with the local committee of the Australasian College of Dental Surgeons for candidates preparing for FRACDS examination, and the Dental Faculty of University of Hong Kong for candidates preparing for the Postgraduate Diploma in General Dental Surgery (PDipGDS). An additional two 1-day seminars were held at weekends on 'Dental Materials Science and Clinical Applications' by Professor Trevor Burke of University of Birmingham and 'Applied Basic Sciences' on clinical anatomy and physiology by Dr James Newton of University of Dundee.

The next diet of conjoint MGDS examination will be conducted in November 20 - 24, 2000 involving written examination, clinical and oral examination and clinic visitation.

Five MGDS holders volunteered as mentors to guide candidates on all aspects of examination preparation including advice on log dairy cases and improvements of clinics.

The Subcommittee supervised continuing professional education activities of MGDS holders. These include journal study clubs with regular meetings, product and equipment evaluation and research (PEER). A couple of new restorative dental products had been evaluated according to an approved protocol. The SEEGDP also identified and assessed training centres for MGDS holders to allow them to gain further experience in the management of complex cases and medically compromised patients requiring special oral health care.

The Subcommittee would like to thank the Education Committee and the Council of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong for their support during the past year.

Dr. Bill Yan, being the Chairman of the Education Committee since early this year, is our new Ex-officio Member. His coming to our Subcommittee further strengthened our team-effort.

I need to express my sincere gratitude to Prof. Urban Hagg, previously our Ex-officio Member, for his unequivocal support. Moreover, I must take this opportunity again to thank Dr. Gary Cheung, who resigned from our Subcommittee in August 1999 due to his already heavy and extensive commitments. His constructive and positive contributions to our Subcommittee should be acknowledged.

Dr. Alec Tam renewed his 2-year term of service commencing in April, 2000. Dr. Zee Kwan Yat is our newly recruited member whose term of office also commenced the same month. With a new composition in our Subcommittee, we are looking forward to serve our College in general, and our Fellows in particular.

### 2. First CME Cycle from 1.1.1997 to 31.12.1999 :

Initially there were a total of 121 Fellows starting off their CME activities belonging to this cycle. However, during the course of the 3-year period, 18 Fellows submitted their respective formal letter of resignation from the College/Academy, with reasons such as retirement or practising overseas.

The remaining 103 Fellows who started the CME cycle in 1.1.1997, 101 of them (98%) have met up with the Academy requirement to obtain 90 CME credits or more. Yearly statements (at the conclusion of the first CME cycle) have been sent to each and every one of them accordingly. A *Certificate of CME for Specialists* has been issued by Hong Kong Academy of Medicine to all those Fellows who complied with the CME requirement.

The names of the two Fellows who failed to comply with the CME requirement have been reported to the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. Their Fellowships have been

terminated by the Academy.

3. CME Cycle from 1.1.1998 to 31.12.2000 :

A total of 8 Fellows fall within this group, the following table is a summary of their CME scores :

## SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE

The Scientific Committee is happy to report two successful scientific events in the year 2000. The main theme of the scientific program was "Multidisciplinary Approach to the Management of Tooth Replacement". Other local speakers, as shown in the attached program, shared their clinical and research experience with the participants. The interdisciplinary manner of presentations and the clinical nature of the lectures attracted a great deal of participants. The meeting attracted more than 200 participants, 25 of which were 5<sup>th</sup> year dental students. The dental students were invited to attend at no cost to help familiarize them with the College and its role in their very near future. In addition to the scientific program, an exhibition to introduce the "Training Pathways and Examination Style" for all specialities was offered in the form of poster presentation and log books for clinical case presentations. A dental exhibition was successfully arranged as well.

The spring social event was hosted by the President of the College, Professor Hägg, at the Shek O Country Club. A memorable evening, listening to the wonderful opera singing of Ms Grace Chan accompanied by the beautiful sounds of solo Chelo player Miss Fong. This meeting set the standard for the upcoming scientific meeting "The 7<sup>th</sup> Annual Scientific Meeting" of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong. The main theme of that meeting is "Ultra Thin Bonded Porcelain Veneers" by Dr Sverker Toreskog.

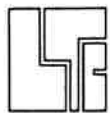

## THE COLLEGE OF DENTAL SURGEONS OF HONG KONG

### NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### 1. STATUS OF THE COLLEGE

The college was incorporated in Hong Kong on 23<sup>rd</sup> February, 1993 as a company limited by guarantee. Every member of the college undertakes to contribute, if required, an amount not exceeding HK\$100 to the assets of the college in the event of its being wound up.

The college is engaged in promoting for the public benefit the advancement of knowledge in the field of dental surgery and its associated subjects and promoting training and research in dental surgery.

#### 2. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### a) Basis of preparation:

The financial statements are prepared under the historical convention, and in accordance with all applicable Statements of Standard Accounting Practice and Interpretations issued by the Hong Kong Society of Accountants, accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance.

##### b) Revenue recognition:

Income from subscription and entrance fees is recognised on an accruals basis.

Income from meeting, course and examination is recognised upon completion of services provided.

Interest income is recognised on a time proportion basis.

##### c) Depreciation on fixed assets:

Fixed assets are depreciated on the straight line method at the following rate:-

College gowns	20% per annum
Leasehold improvement	20% per annum
Furniture and fixtures	20% per annum
Office equipment	20% per annum

##### d) Inventories:

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is calculated by using the weighted average method. Net realisable value is determined by management based on prevailing market conditions.

##### e) Related parties:

Parties are considered to be related if one party has the ability, directly or indirectly to control the other party, or exercise significant influence over the other party in making financial and operating decisions. Parties are also considered to be related if they are subject to common control or common significant influence. Related parties may be individuals or entities.
