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## President's report

There have been some break-throughs during 2003. However, The Dental Ordinance has sadly not been dealt with by the Government despite series of letters from the College, HKDA, the Dental Council of Hong Kong, and other bodies who have supported our request. Nevertheless, the Dental Council has adopted a policy which reflects the spirit of the regulations and guidelines approved by HKAM, i.e. defined specialists in a similar manner as HKAM, which requires an applicant for specialists status to fulfill the requirements stipulated by the HKAM, and finally that 'new' specialties will be need under other 'scheme' to fulfill the requirement for CME in accordance with the regulations provided similar to thereof by HKAM. Despite the inefficiency of the Hong Kong Government to deal with amendments to the Dental Ordinance, which were prepared long time ago, the Dental Council has dealt with this issue in a proper manner and abolish the lower old standard for approving specialists, which indeed is a move very much welcomed by the College. Moreover, this is a similar policy to that adopted, for specialist status, by the Medical Council.

This now means that all of our colleagues, who had their specialist training approved, can call themselves specialists provided they register with the Dental Council. There is no longer a prerequisite to work in the private sector and limit you practice to your specialty. This change in the regulations will make it easier for practitioners to establish a specialist practice and for the public to obtain specialist care.

A new specialty in dentistry, that of Family Dentistry has been approved by HKAM. The College and the Faculty are working in a cohesive fashion to prepare structured training in this innovative specialty, which will offer a solid opportunity for general practitioners in Hong Kong to obtain postgraduate training. This is yet another move by the College to raise the standard of dental care and enhancing dental expertise for the benefit of the population of Hong Kong. It will also produce an opportunity on more members of the Dental profession to join the College (and HKAM), and so strengthen the standing and role of the College.

The SARS outbreak affected the professional activities that were scheduled by the College, and two of its three scheduled Scientific Meetings had to be postponed. One was replaced by a Symposium on SARS with Special Reference to Dentistry, which was held in mid-May and was very well attended. The only remaining scheduled meeting this year is the "International Conference on Evidence-based Advanced Dentistry" which initially received a lot of interest from our overseas colleagues. At this time, in early September, it

seems that SARS and the overseas media have managed to almost totally destroy the attraction of visiting Hong Kong, which has adversely influenced our colleagues from the region and world-wide, who initially had expressed great interest to come and join us. However, the interest from the local dental community to participate is seemingly still strong.

Most of our colleagues who are entitled to be admitted under By-law 16 will have joined the College by the end of this year. It should be noted that this option expires at the end of 2004.

Almost, all of the six established specialties have now conducted both intermediate examinations as con-joint events with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, and exit examinations. This indicating that the examination system of the College is now fully functional.

Finally, I would like to thank the Councilors, members of specialty boards and various committees for their hard and dedicated work over the last year. A special thanks needs to go our Executive Secretary, Ms Ada Houn for her hidden work which is a critical for the running and success of our College. A special thank you goes also to Ms Sandy Li for her assistance at our Scientific Meetings. This year I would like to express my gratitude to the Organizing Committee, headed by Dr Michael Tsui and Ms Louisa Chiu (Deputy Conference Manager, HKAM), for their enthusiastic efforts to make our International Conference and 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary memorable.

It has indeed been a privilege and honor to serve as the College President during 2003, and I would finally like to thank all Fellows and Members for their support.

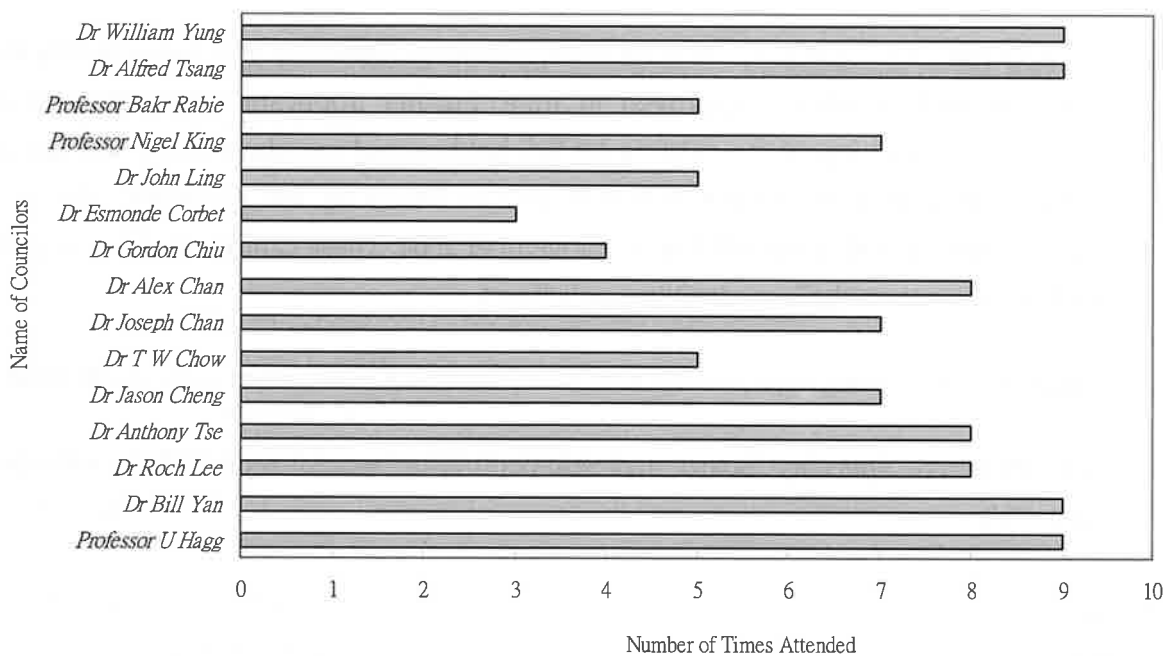

1. The Committee met on 13 January and 16 June during the year to receive reports from the various Specialty Boards and Committees;
2. The lists of Fellows, supervisor/trainers and trainees of each specialty have been updated;
3. A re-accreditation exercise was carried out in April with a visitation team headed by Prof Urban Hagg appointed to visit the various training centres and interview the trainees. As a result the training centres of the specialties in OMS, Orthodontics, Paediatric Dentistry, Prosthodontics, Periodontology and Endodontics have been accredited until April 2008;
4. The application to establish a new specialty in Family Dentistry was submitted to the Academy and eventually approved in June. Further application for approval to recognize the training of the existing MGDS holders and members of the College as comparable to that of the pathway was also endorsed by the Academy. This is a one-off exercise with a cut-off date by November 2004. These candidates have to pass the Exit Assessment before admitting as Fellows.
5. Negotiation was carrying out to establish conjoint Exit Examination with the RCS Ed.
6. The respective specialty board and sub-committee would report their activities separately.

Items that were discussed included:

- (c) Conduct of an exit assessment for an existing Fellow
- (d) Additional training for candidates registered before the rescission of Bylaw 16
- (e) Spring Scientific Meeting of CDSHK in May 2003, jointly coordinated with the Specialty Board in Periodontology, which is now postponed to November 2004 due to the impact of SARS at that time
- (f) A proposal for a conjoint exit Fellowship (RCSEd) / CDSHK specialty exit examination and its possible format.

### 3. Examinations

A conjoint MRD(RCSEd) / CDSHK intermediate examination was held in November 2002. One candidate, Dr Robert Ng, passed the examination and is going on the phase of higher training.

An exit assessment (for an existing fellow, Dr May Ho) was also held May 2003, with Prof. Markus Haapasalo serving as an external advisor/examiner. Dr Ho has been successful in the assessment and has been admitted to the Specialty of Endodontics.

### 4. Scientific meeting and conference

Two members of the Board have been nominated to speak at the International Conference on Evidence-based Advanced Dentistry by CDSHK.

## **Specialty Board in Family Dentistry**

Another successful conjoint MGDS examination in 2002 saw the increase of MGDS holders to twenty four. The task force for the continuing education of general dental practitioners worked tirelessly under the guidance of the Education Committee of the College to construct a vocational training pathway for the general dental practitioners in Hong Kong. In June 2003, the Academy of Medicine approved the establishment of a new specialty of Family Dentistry. This is a milestone in the development of the College and in the history of dentistry in Hong Kong. The Faculty of Dentistry collaborates fully with the College of Dental Surgeons, and both are committed to the continuing professional development of dental practitioners. In addition to the Postgraduate Diploma in General Dental Surgery (PDipGDS) which has been running successfully for 4 years, a new part-time Master in Dental Surgery (Family Dentistry) programme will be offered in September 2004. Besides the Prince Philip Dental Hospital, approved training centres including the Tai Po Ho Miu Ling Nethersole Hospital and Kwong Wah Hospital of the Health Authority will offer training modules to enable general practitioners to develop their careers and attain the status of specialist in Family Dentistry.

At present, six candidates were registered and undergoing training in the Higher Training and five candidates were registered in the Basic Training programme in orthodontics.
- ✧ The Conjoint Membership Examination in Orthodontics 2002 was conducted in November 2002 and all 17 candidates passed. The Gold medal recipient was Dr Lily Shum and runner up was Dr Louise Wong.

- 2 Dr John Dyson was still acting as the representative of the Specialist Society, namely, the Hong Kong Prosthetic Dentistry Society.
- 3 Dr Andrew Dias was retiring from his lectureship of the Faculty of Dentistry and left for Australia. His vacancy would not be filled up till the next election.
- 4 Conjoint Examination between the MRD of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh (RCSEd) and the Intermediate Examination of the Prosthodontics Fellow was held in 13 & 15 November, 2002 at Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Building. All of the four candidates passed the examination and did it quite well.
- 5 The Board approved Dr H K Yip as higher trainee.
- 6 The members received a request of considering Government Services as a training centre in the field of Prosthodontics. After careful consideration, the Board deliberated that the request would be reconsidered when the Government Services set up a specialist centre in Prosthodontics with eligible trainers. The Chairman replied to Dr Bill Yan about this deliberation.
- 7 The Board agreed the advanced diploma in Prosthodontics as a prerequisite training before admitting a trainee to the higher training pathway in the future.
- 8 Exit examination to the FCDSHK (Prosthodontics) and exit assessment to Fellows under By-law 16 were held on 6 – 7 May and 9 May 2003.

The exit assessment consisted of log book presentation, written assignment and log diaries. The exit examination consisted of log book presentation, written

assignment, clinical viva and log diaries. Drs Daniel Fang and Frederick Chu passed the exit examination while Drs Edmond Pow, Katherine Leung, Patrick Wu and Yeung Ka Chun satisfied the exit assessment.

- 9 The training center status of our Specialty, namely, Oral Rehabilitation division of the Faculty of Dentistry, HKU, has been extended to April 2008.
- 10 The Conjoint MRD examination will be holding in November, 2003. The written examination will be held on Monday, 10 November 2003 and the viva examination will be held on Wednesday, 12 November 2003.
- 11 A meeting on 9 September 2003 with Professor McCord by the President of CDSHK and the Chairmen of the Specialty Boards of Endodontics, Periodontology and Prosthodontics. We were informed that The RCSEd was going to revamp the Fellowship of Dental Surgery (FDS) to FDS Orth, FDS OMS, FDS Paed. Dent., FDS Prosthodontics, FDS Endo., FDS Period. The format of the exit examination will be on par with our College.
- 12 At the time of writing this report, the specialty has 2 higher trainees, 1 intermediate trainee and no junior trainee. The Specialty will be holding its second diet of the Intermediate Examination in November 2003.

## Continuing Medical Education Subcommittee

### 1. Retaining the name CME Subcommittee:

In the previous report, the name "CME Committee" was supposedly adopted by our College. At a subsequent meeting, we found out that such a change should need approval from the Academy's Council, which could involve amendment to the CME "principles and guidelines".

While we are still making suggestions and amendments for our CME guidebook, our title "CME Subcommittee" is still applicable for everyone's information.

### 2. Composition of the current CME Subcommittee:

Drs Chow Tak Kun and Kenneth Hui have been serving as committee members for quite a few years. They were nominated to, and re-appointed by, the College Council, for another 2-year term commencing April 2003. All members have assisted me in running the CME Subcommittee smoothly for quite a while; I need to express my sincere gratitude to their efforts.

### 3. CME activities in the year 2003:

Up to August 30, 2003, our CME Subcommittee has pre-approved, endorsed and accredited a total of 326 scientific meetings, locally and overseas; not including the 23 meetings that were cancelled, postponed indefinitely or rescheduled due to the outbreak of SARS.

#### 4. CME Cycles:

Currently we have a total of 10 batches of Fellows undertaking CME activities with the same goals to fulfill the life-long 'continuing medical education' and 'improvement'. New Fellows have been admitted to our College recently; once they have passed the respective formalities of the Academy, they will become the 11<sup>th</sup> batch of Fellows and should start their CME cycle from 1.1.2004.

Academy's Council has the intention to synchronize all CME cycles, and has a target date that practically all Fellows of all Colleges should start / re-start a "new" CME cycle commencing from January 1, 2005. In this connection, all our Fellows would have their respective CME cycle ending on December 31, 2004; whereas the number of CME points required would be calculated on pro rata basis.

##### 4.1 Batch 1 - CME Cycle from 01.01.2003 to 31.12.2004

A total of 99 Fellows are currently in this batch (one Fellow has retired towards the end of last year, and approval has been given to him/her to be exempted from doing CME activities). They have finished their second 3-year CME cycle on December 31, 2002. All of them, except one, have obtained 90 CME credits or more and have met with the CME requirement set by Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. (The exceptional one is, at the moment, working hard to re-gain/re-claim his/her incomplete CME scores). Their CME achievements have already been reported to the Education Committee of our College Council accordingly.

Nevertheless, all of these Fellows are now in their first year of the third 3-year CME cycle. For administrative convenience, the only one Fellow from batch 9 is also included in this group for ease of reference as well as avoiding any embarrassment. A total of 2 years will be involved in this cycle; hence they are anticipated to obtain a minimum of 60 CME points by the end of December 31, 2004. The following table is a summary of their CME scores, up to August 30, 2003:

4.2 Batch 2 - CME Cycle from 01.01.2001 to 31.12.2003:

A total of 8 Fellows are now in this batch (one Fellow has retired earlier this year, and approval has been given to him/her to be exempted from doing CME activities). All of them are in their third year of the second 3-year CME cycle. Their CME scores can be illustrated in the following table, up to August 30, 2003:

Since all of them are in their final year of the respective CME cycle, so reminders would be sent to those who fell short of 90 points.

A total of 12 Fellows fall within this batch, together with the one Fellow from batch 6, there are a total of 13 Fellows in the table. They have all reached the third year of the second 3-year CME cycle (first 3-year cycle for the batch 6 Fellow). The following table is a summary of their CME scores, up to August 30, 2003:

#### 4.5 Batch 5 - CME Cycle from 1.1.2003 to 31.12.2004

4 Fellows belong to this batch. They have finished their first 3-year CME cycle on December 31, 2002. All of them have obtained 90 CME credits or more and have met with the CME requirement by Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. Their CME achievements have been reported to the Education Committee of our College Council accordingly.

Currently they are in the first year of the second 3-year CME cycle. Their CME scores so far can be summarized in the following table, up to August 30, 2003:

Since only one Fellow fall onto this batch and currently in his/her third year of the first CME cycle. As his/her CME scores can easily be identified, so such CME scores are merged onto that in paragraph 4.3 above.

#### 4.7 Batch 7 – CME Cycle from 1.1.2002 to 31.12.2004

A total of 6 Fellow belongs to this batch. They are currently in their second year of the

first CME cycle, their CME scores so far can be shown in the following table:

Their CME cycle would be finished on December 31, 2004 and their CME requirement, by pro rata, adjusted to 75 points minimum.

4.9 Batch 9 – CME cycle from 1.1.2003 to 31.12.2004

Since only one Fellow is included in this batch, and to avoid the chance of being identified easily, he/she is included in paragraph 4.1 above.

For the two years duration, he/she is anticipated to obtain a minimum of 60 CME points by end of December 31, 2004.

4.10 Batch 10 – CME cycle from 1.7.2003 to 31.12.2004

Though only one Fellow is included in this batch, inevitably he/she could not be matched onto any of other batches of Fellows (in terms of CME cycle). In view that he/she will eventually merge onto the 'big family' and starting a new cycle on

January 1, 2005, hence he/she has to be the loner in our CME records for the time being. No CME activities have been recorded for or submitted from him/her so far.

For the one and half year's duration, he/she is anticipated to obtain a minimum of 45 CME points by end of December 31, 2004.

#### **5. Membership & Learning Management System (MLMS)**

The Academy of Medicine's MLMS Committee has initiated on-line self-learning and on-line CME programmes for all Colleges. Our College has joined hand with the Academy and it is already possible to gain CME credits from the internet, at the comfort of your office or home. Moreover, each and every Fellow can check your CME latest scores from the same web-site. For details, please refer to [www.mlms.org.hk](http://www.mlms.org.hk).

Indeed our CME Subcommittee has been working closely with the Academy in making it possible. However, to make the system functional, meaningful and up to date, we still need your support to submit your CME activities promptly and consistently at regular intervals; especially if you have attended CME activities that are not under those with automatic accreditation process (e.g. those activities not organized by our College or College approved programme providers).

#### **6. Handbook on Continuing Medical Education - second edition.**

Our Subcommittee is still in the process of preparing the second edition of the Handbook on CME. This belated edition is under review because there have been suggestions to further sub-categorize CME activities, so that even certain non-dentally related scientific meetings could still be accredited with CME points, likely to be under a different sub-category. Please watch out further details in the not too distant future newsletter.

Three honorary fellows, all with distinguished careers were recommended to the Council for conferment. They are Professor WIR Davies, Professor Yu Shaoming and Professor Zhou Xuedong.

One fellow will be admitted in the specialty of Paediatric Dentistry, while 6 other fellows are in Prosthodontics. They will be admitted at the AGM of the College in November 2003.

Six new members are admitted to the College as members. Two MGDS holders will be admitted in a conjoint ceremony with The Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh on 17 October 2003. The remaining members will be admitted in the dental specialties of Oral Surgery, Orthodontics, Family Dentistry and Prosthodontics during the Conferment Ceremony of the Annual General Meeting.

The new specialty of Family Dentistry has now been established. Exit assessment of trainees of higher training has been conducted, and the membership committee has vetted their applications. We are looking forward to meeting these new fellows in Family Dentistry.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

A modest surplus of \$197,216 was recorded in the Financial Statement for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2003. Membership and subscription fees continued to be a major source of revenue. There was a significant reduction in surpluses from scientific meetings and MGDS revision courses. Reception dinners for speakers as well as increase in costs for organizing lectures accounted for higher expenses incurred in our scientific meetings. The establishment of a website to enhance communication of the MGDS courses for the Conjoint Examinations required a maintenance fee. It was hoped that funds derived from these activities could be channeled back prudently to benefit their subscribers more directly.

On the expenditure side, the purchase of 500 impressive diploma folders for use in future conferment ceremonies had incurred an increase in the stationery and printing costs. As a gesture to thank our guests and fellows who had made various contributions to our College, invitations were extended to these individuals to attend our Annual Dinner at the College's Function expenses. This was considered a well worth and joyous occasion to strengthen fellowship and renew acquaintances.

My sincere appreciation is due to our Executive Secretary, Miss Ada Houn for her tremendous secretarial assistance and I owed much to the unfailing support of the College Council.

I would also like to express my sincere gratitude to our Honorary Auditor, Messrs. Li Tang, Chen & Co. Without their professional service, my task would be impossible to accomplish.



## NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### 1. STATUS OF THE COLLEGE

The college was incorporated in Hong Kong on 23<sup>rd</sup> February, 1993 as a company limited by guarantee. Every member of the college undertakes to contribute, if required, an amount not exceeding HK\$100 to the assets of the college in the event of its being wound up.

The college is engaged in promoting for the public benefit the advancement of knowledge in the field of dental surgery and its associated subjects and promoting training and research in dental surgery.

### 2. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### a) Basis of preparation:

The financial statements are prepared under the historical convention, and in accordance with all applicable Statements of Standard Accounting Practice and Interpretations issued by the Hong Kong Society of Accountants, accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong. The following revised SSAPs are effective for the first time for the current year's financial statements:-

SSAP 1 (Revised): "Presentation of financial statements"

#### b) Revenue recognition:

Income from subscription and entrance fees is recognised on an accruals basis.

Income from meeting, course and examination is recognised upon completion of services provided.

Sales of college ties are recognised when college ties are delivered.

Interest income is recognised on a time proportion basis.

#### c) Depreciation on fixed assets:

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses.

Fixed assets are depreciated on the straight line method at the following rate:-

College gowns	20% per annum
Leasehold improvement	20% per annum
Furniture and fixtures	20% per annum
Office equipment	20% per annum

#### d) Inventories:

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is calculated by using the weighted average method. Net realisable value is determined by management based on prevailing market conditions.

2. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

e) Related parties:

Parties are considered to be related if one party has the ability, directly or indirectly to control the other party, or exercise significant influence over the other party in making financial and operating decisions. Parties are also considered to be related if they are subject to common control or common significant influence. Related parties may be individuals or entities.

f) Cash equivalents:

Cash equivalents are short-term, highly liquid investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash without notice and which were within three months of maturity when acquired.
