President's Report

I would like to thank all officer bearers and councillors for their staunch support, wise counsel and hard work in managing College business in the past year. It was a real privilege for me to serve my presidency with such a dedicated team of senior colleagues in the profession.

The College is now in its 16th year of operation. With over 250 fellows and over 100 members, we have grown into a sizable organisation with eight Specialty Boards and numerous committees. To support an ever increasing workload and many new initiatives, our Secretariat has recently expanded to 4 full time staff. Another inevitable aspect of growth in an organisation is the increased in complexity of its operation. Over the years, the College Council has adopted various measures from time to time, to handle challenges that were encountered. However, these measures were sometimes ad hoc in nature and have not been incorporated into our operation. With Dr. S K Chan and Professor Edward Lo taking the lead, the College Council has initiated steps to strengthen the governance of the College. Council resolutions, regulations and rules made by previous Councils have been organised, documented and enforced. Procedures to appoint Chairmen and Members of Specialty Boards and Committees have been defined. Procedures to screen and admit fellows and members have been streamlined. The College is developing a more robust system in the registration and monitoring of our trainees. The training guidelines of all specialties are being reviewed to remove ambiguity and to provide clearer guidance to existing and potential trainees.

Dr. Raymond Lee and I visited the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons on 26th February and discussed possible collaboration on training in General Dentistry. At the request of the Ministry of Health and on behalf of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM), Dr. Roch Lee and Dr. John Ling paid a site visit to the Peking University School of Stomatology on 17 April. The purpose of the visit was to report on the progress of a pilot admission system of specialists in the Mainland. A report of the visit was submitted to the Ministry of Health and there was also a meeting with the Vice-Minister of Health, Professor Huang Jie-fu, on 24th June. I attended the 43rd Singapore-Malaysia Congress of Medicine from 6 to 8 August. I met with the President and Council Members of the newly constituted College of Dental Surgeons of Singapore and discussed possibility of future collaboration in organising scientific meetings. Dr. S K Chan and Dr. Robert Ng participated in a RTHK Programme broadcasted on 28th August to promote the HKAM and our College. As a result of our participation, the College was invited by the RTHK to participate in a further series of 5 programmes on dental topics of our choice.

The 31st Asia Pacific Dental Congress organised by the Hong Kong Dental Association in May provided a wide range of CPD programmes for our Fellows. As a support to the Congress, we did not organise any Spring Scientific Meeting this year. However, our Autumn Scientific Meeting will be held on 15 November and Fellows of our College will be offered free participation. Chairman of our Scientific Committee, Professor W K Leung, is working

on a joint congress on implant dentistry next November with the European Association for Osseointegration.

Thanks to the hard work of Dr. Raymond Lee and his Committee of General Dentistry, our Membership in General Dentistry (MGD) training programme was well received by the profession. We now have 47 trainees enrolled in the programme and we have successfully recruited 12 trainers and 18 examiners. A winter training programme is now in place and I urge all Members and Fellows to continue to support the College's effort to promote a high standard dental care in general dentistry for the benefit of our community.

Our Council held a total of eleven council meetings during the year and I would like to thank the tireless efforts of all Members of the Council. Special thanks should go to Ms Rose Chow, Ms Gladys Yeung, Ms Lilian Cheung and Ms. Sharon Tam for their excellent administrative and secretarial support.



> Meetings

The Specialty Board has dealt with various matters in 2008-09, often via emails. A total of two meetings have been held in this period.

Approval as training centre for Higher Training

After a site visitation by a team from the Education and Examinations Committee of CDSHK, the MacLehose Dental Centre (2/F clinic) has been accepted as a training centre for Higher Training (only).

Supplementary training for a College fellow

The requirements and the format of training and assessment for one fellow (in the general restorative field before the Special Board was founded) who is electing Endodontics as his specialty field.

Revision of the Guidelines (i.e. training pathway)

Meetings were held to discuss the wording of the published Guidelines for the Endodontics specialty. Some additional discussion with the Education and Examinations Committee will take place in view of the desire (by the Academy) to reword the Guidelines into a competency based proposal.

> Examinations

The conjoint intermediate/MRD Examinations in 2008 had two candidates who elected Endodontics as the specialty field and attained a passing grade. They have subsequently applied to higher training in the specialty. The next diet of examinations will be held on 16-18 November 2009, for which one (1) candidate will be sitting for the Endodontic part.

An Exit examination was held in December 2008, in which one candidate, Dr. Angela W L Ho has successfully fulfilled all requirements of the Endodontic specialty and was recommended for fellowship of the College and of HKAM (congratulations welcome to Dr. Ho). It is envisaged that another candidate may be ready to sit for the Exit examination in 2009-2010.

The Committee was invited to consider a number of applications from time to time in the year 2008-2009. With the advance in modern day communication technology, we were able to maintain close contact and with internet conferencing and voting. Different opinions were voiced out and settled in a democratic way.

With the support of the Secretariat led by Dr. S K CHAN, new application forms, detailing registrable qualifications and separate training periods facilitating future vetting for membership and fellowship, were designed and approved by the Council for use. This greatly accelerates the efficiency in the processing of applications.

This year, the Committee had the honor to admit 3 Honorary Fellows. They are Professor Robin Alan SEYMOUR (Periodontology), Professor John Andrew SANDHAM (Orthodontics), Professor GE lihong (Paediatric Dentistry).

We also admitted 6 Fellows (1 Endodontics, 3 Periodontology and 2 Prosthodontics) and 13 Members (1 Community Dentistry, 1 Endodontics, 1 Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery, 5 Orthodontics, 1 Paediatric Dentistry and 4 Periodontology) with 2 more Members in Endodontics waiting for approval.

In addition to the 18 Members in General Dentistry admitted last year, 40 more were admitted making a total of 58 MGDs. Membership in General Dentistry is granted to registered dentists who engaged in the practice of general dentistry for not less than ten years, possessing at least one relevant credit transferable post-graduate qualification registrable with the DCHK. They must also participate in Supervised Dental Practice Programme and the CME programme.

The Committee is also in debt to the staff of the College for their hard work in preparing all the necessary documents and coordinating the relevant procedures.

Scientific Meetings Committee

The Scientific Meetings Committee is pleased to report that our 2008 Autumn Scientific Meeting was successfully held in the Lim Por Yen Lecture Theatre of the HKAM Jockey Club Building on Sunday 31 August 2008 with an attendance of over 130. The two speakers were Dr. Robert Wassell, Consultant and Senior Lecturer in Restorative Dentistry at School of Dental Sciences of Newcastle University, UK, and Dr. Amar Naru experienced private practitioner in occlusion, restorative dentistry and tissue management based in the North East of England. Dr. Wassell, thoroughly presented major themes on the topic of clinical occlusion such as occlusal examination, planning, and occlusal problems. Video demonstrations were given throughout the lecture to illustrate clinical execution of various techniques in relation to restorative dentistry. Dr. Naru skilfully demonstrated with the help of digital graphics and three-dimensional computer animation the importance of various normal occlusal movements and occlusal problems. Both lecturers further addressed controversies in occlusal concepts in dentistry by a vast number of clinical pictures and related evidence-based literatures. Their lecture contributed significantly to the audience's understanding of occlusion in general and of its application in clinical practice in particular.

On 16 November 2008, the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong hosted a Sunday morning session at the HKAM 15th Anniversary Congress. The first session is chaired by Dr. Chan Sai-kwing. The title was "Obstructive sleep apnoea syndrome: what is the role of dental profession?". The speaker is Professor Cheung Lim-kwong, Chair Professor of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, the University of Hong Kong. Professor Cheung updated the audience with the recent development in the management of Obstructive Sleep Apnoea Syndrome, including distraction osteogenesis. The second session was chaired by Professor Edward CM Lo. The title was "Dental management of patients with special health care needs" by Dr. Cynthia KY Yiu, Associate Professor in Paediatric Dentistry, the University of Hong Kong. Dr. Yiu shared with the audience her expertise and experience in providing dental care to the handicapped and chronically ill children. It has been noted that there were many fellows from other Colleges in the audience, e.g. Anaesthesiologists, Paediatrians, Physicians, just to name a few. Thanks to our speakers, the theme of the 15th Anniversary Celebration Programme, "Working together: The Power of Collaboration", had been clearly echoed and once again realized within the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine.

On November 15, 2009 Dr. Nils-Gunnar Berg, expert in CAD/CAM restorative dentistry, Sweden together with Professor Klaus Lang, Professor Lim K Cheung, Dr. Ricky Wong, Dr. Yanqi Yang, from Faculty of Dentistry the University of Hong Kong, and local speakers Dr. Thomas Li and Dr. Kenneth Luk will contribute a one day conference titled "Advances in High-tech Dentistry 2009". The continuing education event is organized by the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong and HKU Faculty of Dentistry. The speakers shall provide update to conference attendees regarding reconstructive dentistry including CAD/CAM technologies, surgical navigation in maxillofacial and implant dentistry, lingual orthodontic

appliances using the CAD/CAM approach, electronic study models, cone-beam computed tomography and lasers in dentistry.

I would like to thank all the members of the Scientific Meetings Committee nominated by the various specialty boards of the College for their contributions. Special thanks go to immediate past Chairman, Professor Edward C.M. Lo and the Secretariat staff of the College, especially Ms. Mimi Cheung, Ms. Gladys Yeung, Ms. Lilian Cheung, Ms. Rose Chow and Ms. Sharon Tam for their indispensable assistance in organizing the above scientific meetings.

Treasurer's Report

The College recorded a small amount of deficit totalling HK\$10,064 for the financial year ended 31st March 2009.

The management fee, salaries and allowances of the secretariat remained as our main areas of expenditure. With the increase in our membership, the administrative team had to be strengthened with more manpower to cater for the increase in the workload. We also ran up to a deficit of HK\$44,516.00 from conducting our scientific meeting. However, the benefit of the scientific meetings towards our members could not and should not be measured in monetary terms. In this respect, the Council had decided to offer free admissions to all our College fellows to one of our scientific meetings.

The accumulated fund of the College has by now reached 3.46 million. With the council's decision of adopting a conservative policy with respect to our investment, we had sailed through the credit crunch unscratched. However, the downside of such conservative approach was that the interest generated from the fixed deposit was only HK\$13,180.

On behalf of the College, I would like to convey our sincere gratitude to our Honorary Auditors, Mr. Li Ka Cheung Eric of Messrs. Li, Tang, Chen & Co. for his valuable professional advice and services in the past year. Mr. Li has kindly offered himself for reappointment. Special thanks are also due to our College staff for their excellent secretarial support.

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. STATUS OF THE COLLEGE

The college was incorporated in Hong Kong on 23rd February, 1993 as a company limited by guarantee. Every member of the college undertakes to contribute, if required, an amount not exceeding HK\$100 to the assets of the college in the event of its being wound up.

The address of the registered office of the college is Room 902, HKAM Jockey Club Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Aberdeen, Hong Kong.

The college is engaged in promoting for the public benefit the advancement of knowledge in the field of dental surgery and its associated subjects and promoting training and research in dental surgery.

The financial statements are presented in Hong Kong dollars which is the same as the functional currency of the college.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRSs") (which also include Hong Kong Accounting Standards ("HKASs") and Interpretations ("HK - Int") issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA"), accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. They have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with HKFRSs requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

The HKICPA has issued a number of Hong Kong Accounting Standards, HKFRSs, amendments and interpretations which are effective during the year. The councillors of the college consider these standards, amendments and interpretations do not have any impact on the college's financial statements since they are not relevant to the college.

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Property, plant and equipment:

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The cost of an asset comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition and location for its intended use. Expenditure incurred after the property, plant and equipment have been put into operation, such as repairs and maintenance, is normally charged to the income and expenditure account in the period in which it is incurred. In situations where it can be clearly demonstrated that the expenditure has resulted in an increase in the future economic benefits expected to be obtained from the use of the property, plant and equipment, the expenditure is councillors as an additional cost of that asset.

Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is calculated by the straight-line method to allocate cost to their residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

College gowns	20% per annum
Leasehold improvement	20% per annum
Furniture and fixtures	20% per annum
Office equipment	20% per annum

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date. An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognized upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected to arise from the continued use of the asset. The gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net sale proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset is included in the income and expenditure account in the year in which the item is derecognized).

b) Inventories:

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is calculated by using the weighted average method. Net realizable value is determined by management based on prevailing market conditions.

c) Impairment:

At each balance sheet date, an assessment is made whether there is any indication of impairment of any asset, or whether there is any indication that an impairment loss previously recognised for an asset in prior years may no longer exist or may have decreased. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognised whenever the carrying amount of an asset or its cash-generating unit exceeds its recoverable amount.

A previously recognised impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount of an asset, however not to an amount higher than the carrying amount that would have been determined (net of any depreciation), had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset in prior years.

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

d) Revenue recognition:

Income from subscription and entrance fees is recognised on an accruals basis.

Income from meeting, course and examination is recognised upon completion of services provided.

Interest income is recognised as it accrues using effective interest method.

e) Related parties:

For the purposes of these financial statements, parties are considered to be related to the college if the college has the ability, directly or indirectly, to control the party or exercise significant influence over the party in making financial and operating decisions, or vice versa, or where the college and the party are subject to common control or common significant influence. Related parties may be individuals (being members of key management personnel, councillors and/or their close family members) or other entities and include entities which are under the significant influence of related parties of the college where those parties are individuals and post-employment benefit plans which are for the benefit of employees of the college or of any entity that is a related party of the college.

f) Cash and cash equivalents:

For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and demand deposits, and short term highly liquid investments which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value, and have a short maturity of generally within three months when acquired, less bank overdrafts which are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the college's cash management.

g) Retirement benefit costs:

The college joins a defined contribution retirement scheme under the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance (the "MPF Scheme") for those employees of the college.

The college's contributions to the MPF Scheme are made based on a percentage of the eligible employees' relevant income as defined in the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance. These contributions are expensed as incurred. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the college in independently administered funds.

h) Government grants:

Government grants are recognized in the balance sheet initially when there is reasonable assurance that they will be received and that the college will comply with the conditions attaching to them. Grants that compensate the college for expenses incurred are recognized as revenue in profit or loss on a systematic basis in the same periods in which the expenses are incurred. Grants that compensate the college for the cost of an asset are deducted in arriving at the carrying amount of the asset and consequently are recognized in profit or loss over the useful life of the asset.

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

4. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The college's major financial instruments comprise interest receivable, cash and bank balances and accrued expenses.

The main risks arising from the college's financial instruments are interest rate risk, credit risk, liquidity risk and foreign exchange risk. The college does not have any written risk management policies and guidelines. However, the board of councillors meet periodically to analyze and formulate measures to manage the college's exposure to these risks. Generally, the college introduces conservative strategies on its risk management. As the college's exposure to these risks is kept to a minimum, the college has not used any derivatives and other instruments for hedging purposes. The councillors review and agree policies for managing each of these risks and they are summarized as follows:

a) Interest rate risk

The college has interest-bearing bank deposits and no interest-bearing liabilities. The councillors consider that the interest rate risk is not significant.

b) Credit risk

As at 31st March, 2009, the financial assets of the college that were exposed to credit risk and their maximum exposures were as follows:

d) Foreign exchange risk

The college carries out its activities in Hong Kong and most of the transactions are denominated in Hong Kong Dollars. Accordingly, the councillors of the college consider the college's foreign exchange risk to be insignificant.

e) Fair value estimation

The college's financial assets and financial liabilities have their carrying amounts approximately equal to their fair values due to their immediate and short-term maturities.

c) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that funds will not be available to meet liabilities as they fall due, and it results from amount and maturity mismatches of assets and liabilities.

Prudent liquidity risk management implies maintaining sufficient bank balances.

The following table details the remaining contractual maturities at the balance sheet date of the college's financial liabilities which are based on contractual undiscounted cash flows and the earliest date the college can be required to pay.
