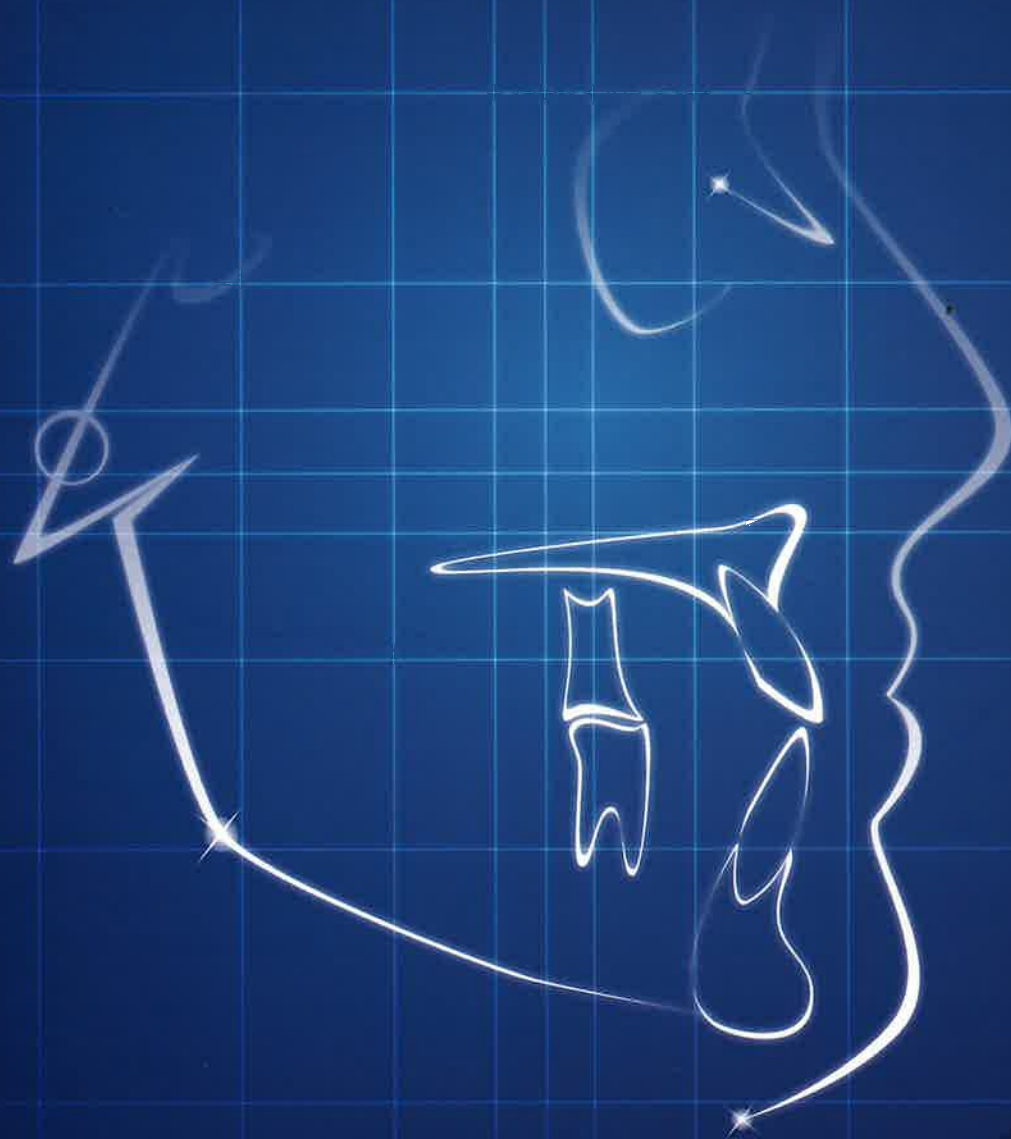

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## President's Report

This is my second term of office as President and I would like to thank all office bearers and councillors for their constant support and wise counsel during my term of office. It was a real privilege to work with such a dedicated and hardworking team of colleagues in the profession.

The College Council has continued with its effort to strengthen the governance of the College. We have requested and encouraged all trainees to register with the College as soon as possible. We understand that some potential trainees need time to decide whether they want to pursue a full 6-year training pathway. They may not wish to register with the College during their initial phase of training. However, we had quite a number of trainees who only register with the College just before they took their intermediate examination. This means that the College had to retrospectively recognise up to 4 years of their basic training and precluded us from monitoring the progress of all these trainees during this period of time. With the new measures in place, the College has a much better grasp of the training activities in its accredited training centres.

Professor Edward Lo and members of the Education Committee has worked extremely hard this year in revamping the Guidelines for Accreditation and Training in Family Dentistry. The revised document grouped the training contents into different domains and competency statements and removed a number of ambiguities which were inherited from training pathways drafted in the 1990s. The revised guidelines are more consistent with modern education standards and provide clearer guidance and direction to trainees. The revised Guidelines were approved by the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM) in September. It is our hope that new document will serve as a blueprint for updating Guidelines in other specialties.

In July 2010, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) was signed between the College and the Hong Kong Dental Association (HKDA). The MOU appointed HKDA as the training programme administrator of the Membership in General Dentistry (MGD). Dr. Raymond Lee and HKDA had put together comprehensive training programmes for the spring, autumn and winter sessions with eminent local and overseas speakers. Our overseas speakers this year were Professor Trevor Burke from Birmingham, UK; Professor Laurence Walsh from Queensland, Australia and Associate Professor Douglas Stewart from Sydney, Australia. The first MGD Part I examination will be held on 9<sup>th</sup> January 2011.

Our collaboration with the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons (RACDS) continues to develop with a visit of their President-Elect, Associate Professor Werner

Bischof and their CEO, Mr. Stephen Robbins in June. We learned of the development of Dental Public Health as a special stream in RACDS and we have proposed exploring further collaboration with our Specialty Board in Community Dentistry.

Dr. Roch Lee and the CME sub-committee had updated the Principles and Guidelines on CME/CPD for the new CME cycle starting from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2011. The new guidelines will conform to revised requirements of the HKAM and will be distributed to fellows in due course. We have been requested by the Dental Council of Hong Kong to develop guidelines for the provision of dental implants in Hong Kong. Dr. Roch Lee is chairing a taskforce and a draft document is under consideration by the Council. At the request of the Macau SAR Government and on behalf of the HKAM, our College representatives will be forming an Assessment Panel for the Consultant rank in Stomatology with Dr. Roch Lee as the Chairman.

At the invitation of the HKDA, the College participated in the 1<sup>st</sup> HK International Dental Expo & Symposium (HKIDEAS) in June to promote our training pathways and conjoint examinations with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. Thanks to the hard work of Professor W K Leung and the local organising committee, the 2010 Joint Congress on Implant Dentistry will take place on 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> November.

Our Council held a total of 11 council meetings during the year and I would like to thank the tireless efforts of all Members of the Council. Special thanks should go to Ms Rose Chow, Ms Lilian Cheung, Ms. Sharon Tam and Ms Julia Lau for their excellent administrative and secretarial support.

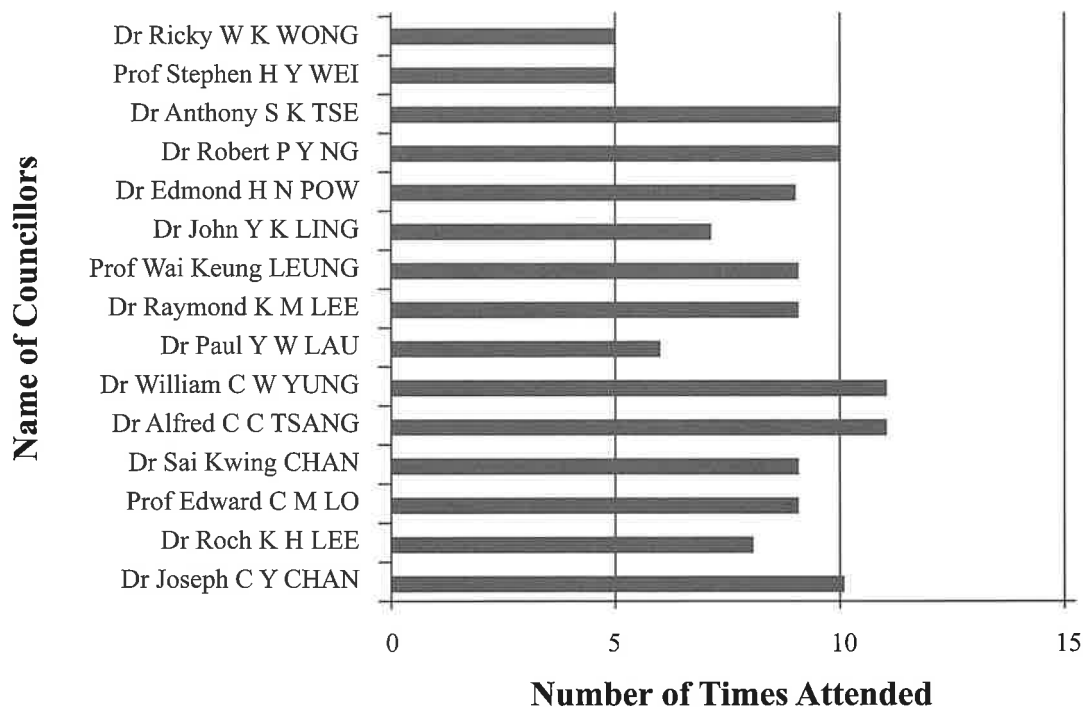

Following the policy of the College Council, all future members of the CME Sub-committee will have a new term of office commencing from 1 January instead of 1 April.

## 2. HKAM Programme (CME/CPD Cycle from 1 January 2008 to 31 December 2010) for Fellows:

## Scientific Meetings Committee

The Scientific Meetings Committee co-organized with the Faculty of Dentistry, The University of Hong Kong the 2009 Conjoint Winter Scientific Meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> November at the HKAM Building. The title of the whole day meeting was: *Advances and High-tech Dentistry 2009*. The invited overseas speaker was Dr. Nils-Gunnar Berg from Sweden speaking on CAD/CAM restorative dentistry. Local speakers include fellows and members of the CDSHK as well as teaching staff from the Faculty of Dentistry and they were Professor Niklaus Lang, Professor Lim K. Cheung, Dr. Ricky Wong, Dr. Yanqi Yang, from Faculty of Dentistry, the University of Hong Kong, and local speakers Dr. Thomas Li and Dr. Kenneth Luk. The speakers presented the most updated procedures, latest state of the art equipment and contemporary research findings in surgical navigation in maxillofacial and implant dentistry, lingual orthodontic appliances using the CAD/CAM approach, electronic study models, cone-beam computed tomography and lasers in dentistry to the audience. The event was well-attended and was supported by the dental trade.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> May 2010, the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong hosted the 2010 Spring Scientific Meeting featuring home speakers from all eight specialties of the College. In the order of their presentations, they were Dr. Frankie H. C. So of *Community Dentistry*, Dr. Anita T. Y. Wong of *Prosthodontics*, Dr. Cynthia K. Y. Yiu of *Paediatric Dentistry*, Professor Lim K. Cheung of *Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery*, Professor Esmonde F. Corbet of Periodontology, Dr. Franklin T. T. She of Orthodontics, Dr. Haston W. M. Liu of *Family Dentistry* and Dr. Ho Wing Lam of *Endodontics*. Again our speakers share their most updated knowledge, state-of-the-art patient management approaches and their contemporary research findings relevant to their specialties and dentistry. The presentations were well received.

On 3<sup>rd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> November 2010, The College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong is collaborating with the European Association for Osseointegration (EAO), represented by the Global Council for Osseointegration (GCO), to hold a 3-day congress on implant dentistry. The venue will be the HKAM Jockey Club Building. The provisional speakers includes 23 local and international luminaries in the field of implant dentistry from Europe and Asia Pacific, on an array of topics from different perspectives on implant dentistry advancement, knowledge, research and development. Special recognition is given to world leaders of the field e.g. Professor Niklaus Lang, *Professor Friedrich Neukam* (Germany) and *Professor Christoph Hämmerle* (Switzerland), to name a few.

I would like to thank all the members of the Scientific Meetings Committee nominated by the various specialty boards of the College for their contributions. Special thanks go to the Secretariat staff of the College, especially Ms Rose Chow, Ms Lilian Cheung, Ms Julia Lau, Ms Sharon Tam and Ms Gladys Yeung for their indispensable assistance in organizing the above scientific meetings.



## **NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

### **1. STATUS OF THE COLLEGE**

The college was incorporated in Hong Kong on 23<sup>rd</sup> February, 1993 as a company limited by guarantee. Every member of the college undertakes to contribute, if required, an amount not exceeding HK\$100 to the assets of the college in the event of its being wound up.

The address of the registered office of the college is Room 902, HKAM Jockey Club Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Aberdeen, Hong Kong.

The college is engaged in promoting for the public benefit the advancement of knowledge in the field of dental surgery and its associated subjects and promoting training and research in dental surgery.

The financial statements are presented in Hong Kong dollars which is the same as the functional currency of the college.

### **2. ADOPTION OF NEW AND REVISED HONG KONG FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS ("HKFRSs")**

The following revised standards and amendments which are relevant to the college's financial statements have been adopted in the current year but have no effect on the amounts reported in these financial statements.

- HKAS 1 (revised 2007), Presentation of Financial Statements
- Amendments to HKFRS 7, Financial Instruments: Disclosures – Improving Disclosures about Financial Instruments
- Improvements to HKFRSs (2008)

HKAS 1 (revised 2007) has introduced terminology changes (including revised titles for the financial statements) and changes in the presentation and disclosures of financial statements. The revised standard requires the entity to present, in a statement of changes in funds, all owner changes in equity. All non-owner changes in funds (i.e. comprehensive income) are required to be presented in one statement of comprehensive income or two statements (a separate income statement and a statement of comprehensive income). The college has elected to present one statement of comprehensive income. This change in presentation has no effect on reported surplus or deficit, total income and expense or net assets for any period presented. Accordingly, the comparative figures have not been restated. In addition, the college has adopted the revised title "Statement of cash flows" for the "Cash flows Statement".

The amendments to HKFRS 7 requires expanded disclosures about the fair value measurement of the college's financial instruments, categorising these fair value measurements into a three-level fair values hierarchy according to the extent to which they are based on observable market data. This amendment has no material impact on the college's financial statements as the college has no such financial instruments.

The improvements to HKFRSs (2008) have had no material impact on the college's financial statements.

The college has not early applied the other new standards, amendments and interpretations that have been issued but not yet effective (see note 14).

## NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### 3. BASIS OF PREPARATION

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRSs") (which also include Hong Kong Accounting Standards ("HKASs") and Interpretations ("HK - Int") issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA"), accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. They have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with HKFRSs requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

### 4. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### a) Property, plant and equipment:

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The cost of an asset comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition and location for its intended use. Expenditure incurred after the property, plant and equipment have been put into operation, such as repairs and maintenance, is normally charged to the statement of comprehensive income in the period in which it is incurred. In situations where it can be clearly demonstrated that the expenditure has resulted in an increase in the future economic benefits expected to be obtained from the use of the property, plant and equipment, the expenditure is recognised as an additional cost of that asset.

Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is calculated by the straight-line method to allocate cost to their residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

College gowns	20% per annum
Leasehold improvement	20% per annum
Furniture and fixtures	20% per annum
Office equipment	20% per annum

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date. An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

### 4. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

#### a) Property, plant and equipment: (cont'd)

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognized upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected to arise from the continued use of the asset. The gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net sale proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset is included in the statement of comprehensive income in the year in which the item is derecognized).

#### b) Inventories:

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is calculated by using the weighted average method. Net realizable value is determined by management based on prevailing market conditions.

#### c) Impairment:

At each balance sheet date, an assessment is made whether there is any indication of impairment of any asset, or whether there is any indication that an impairment loss previously recognised for an asset in prior years may no longer exist or may have decreased. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated. An impairment loss is recognised whenever the carrying amount of an asset or its cash-generating unit exceeds its recoverable amount.

A previously recognised impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount of an asset, however not to an amount higher than the carrying amount that would have been determined (net of any depreciation), had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset in prior years.

#### d) Revenue recognition:

Income from subscription and entrance fees is recognised on an accruals basis.

Income from meeting, course and examination is recognised upon completion of services provided.

Interest income is recognised as it accrues using effective interest method.

#### e) Related parties:

For the purposes of these financial statements, parties are considered to be related to the college if the college has the ability, directly or indirectly, to control the party or exercise significant influence over the party in making financial and operating decisions, or vice versa, or where the college and the party are subject to common control or common significant influence. Related parties may be individuals (being members of key management personnel, councillors and/or their close family members) or other entities and include entities which are under the significant influence of related parties of the college where those parties are individuals and post-employment benefit plans which are for the benefit of employees of the college or of any entity that is a related party of the college.

### 4. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

#### f) Cash and cash equivalents:

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and demand deposits, and short term highly liquid investments which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value, and have a short maturity of generally within three months when acquired, less bank overdrafts which are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the college's cash management.

#### g) Retirement benefit costs:

The college joins a defined contribution retirement scheme under the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance (the "MPF Scheme") for those employees of the college.

The college's contributions to the MPF Scheme are made based on a percentage of the eligible employees' relevant income as defined in the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance. These contributions are expensed as incurred. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the college in independently administered funds.

#### h) Government grants:

Government grants are recognized in the balance sheet initially when there is reasonable assurance that they will be received and that the college will comply with the conditions attaching to them. Grants that compensate the college for expenses incurred are recognized as revenue in the statement of comprehensive income on a systematic basis in the same periods in which the expenses are incurred. Grants that compensate the college for the cost of an asset are deducted in arriving at the carrying amount of the asset and consequently are recognized in the statement of comprehensive income over the useful life of the asset.

### 5. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The college's major financial instruments comprise interest receivable, cash and bank balances and accrued expenses.

The main risks arising from the college's financial instruments are interest rate risk, credit risk, liquidity risk and foreign exchange risk. The college does not have any written risk management policies and guidelines. However, the board of councillors meet periodically to analyze and formulate measures to manage the college's exposure to these risks. Generally, the college introduces conservative strategies on its risk management. As the college's exposure to these risks is kept to a minimum, the college has not used any derivatives and other instruments for hedging purposes. The councillors review and agree policies for managing each of these risks and they are summarized as follows:

#### a) Interest rate risk

The college has interest-bearing bank deposits and no interest-bearing liabilities. The councillors consider that the interest rate risk is not significant.

The college carries out its activities in Hong Kong and most of the transactions are denominated in Hong Kong Dollars. Accordingly, the councillors of the college consider the college's foreign exchange risk to be insignificant.

#### e) Fair value estimation

The college's financial assets and financial liabilities have their carrying amounts approximately equal to their fair values due to their immediate and short-term maturities.

## c) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that funds will not be available to meet liabilities as they fall due, and it results from amount and maturity mismatches of assets and liabilities.

Prudent liquidity risk management implies maintaining sufficient bank balances.
