President's Report

It had been a busy and colourful year decorated with many exciting events and it gave me great pleasure to write this annual report. This year, we saw Prof Stephen H Y Wei who was one of our Past Presidents; and Dr William C W Yung who had served continuously in the College Council for 12 years leaving the Council; and we saw Dr Katherine C M Leung and Dr S Y Cho joining the Council as Councillors for the first time. The College welcomed Dr S K Chan as the new VP (General Affairs & CPD), Dr Edmond H N Pow as the new Honorary Secretary, and Dr Robert P Y Ng as the new Censor-in-Chief. Prof Edward C M Lo and Dr Alfred C C Tsang had kindly remained as VP (Education & Examinations) and as Honorary Treasurer respectively. This year the Council had also formed a new House Committee to help looking after the day to day running of the Secretariat which consisted of 4 full-time staff members.

The Education & Examinations Committee had revised the various application forms and had strengthened the documentation and monitoring of all the trainees. Once again, the College had conducted many Intermediate Examinations jointly with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh. Exit Examinations were also being conducted in Endodontics, in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery, in Orthodontics and in Paediatric Dentistry. Nine College Fellows were admitted by the Academy Conferment Ceremony on 17 December 2010 and added to the list of FHKAM (Dental Surgery). At the HKAM EGM on 16 June 2011, six College Fellows were admitted by the Academy and I would like to congratulate all of them on their accomplishment.

In November 2010 the College held a "Joint Congress on Implant Dentistry" together with the Global Committee on Osseointegration. Gratitude must be extended to Prof W K Leung for chairing the Local Organising Committee and for organizing such a successful and educational event. In the same month, the College published one piece of important document, "Guidelines for the Provision of Dental Implants", setting out the training requirements for the different levels of implant treatment, the various considerations in placing dental implants, the importance of implant maintenance and documentation as well as the importance of quality assurance. On 15 May 2011, a Spring Scientific Meeting was conducted with the theme of "Community Dentistry"; and on 20 November 2011 there would be a Winter Scientific Meeting with the theme of "Endodontics".

The last CME/CPD cycle stipulated by HKAM had ended at the end of 2010. When the profiles of all Fellows had been finalized, only one Fellow needed to complete his remedial CME before the end of 2011, and at the same time, he had to fulfil the requirements of the new cycle. In the new 3-year cycle starting from 1 January 2011 there was a revised set of "Principles & Guidelines on CME/CPD" which was available on the College Website for all Fellows' reference.

Much time and great efforts had been offered by Dr Raymond K M Lee and his Committee for General Dentistry in organizing the training and examination for general dental practitioners. The very first diet of the <u>MGD Part I Examination</u> had been conducted on 9 January 2011. It was an important milestone for the College. The <u>MGD Part II Examination</u>

was successfully conducted in August with the assistance of four external examiners. On 20 August 2011, I met the President-Elect of the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons, Prof Pearlman, in exploring the possibility of further collaboration in bringing together the two examinations of MRACDS and MGD(CDSHK). It was of course a consequence of the exchange of MOU with RACDS in December 2010. Dr Raymond K M Lee's contribution was much appreciated.

Those Fellows who attended our Conferment and Annual Dinner would have noticed that the College had produced some <u>new College Gowns</u> with eye-catching design. I must thank Dr Robert P Y Ng for his effort in this matter.

On 7 June 2011 the Council of HKAM met the Minister of Health of the PRC, Prof Chen Zhu, who gave an introduction of the Health Reform in the Mainland and informed about the progress in the development of specialists in the Mainland. Two levels of cooperation would be possible between HKAM and the Mainland, the drawing up of guidelines and the training/examination for specialists. Further discussions would certainly be held on the details of these issues. Our College awaited eagerly our contribution in these issues.

In July, I joined a HKAM delegation in attending the <u>45th Singapore-Malaysia Congress of Medicine</u> held in Singapore and renewed friendship with our counterparts from those two countries. It was a privilege to be part of the platform party and to enjoy an oration presented by our own Secretary for Food & Health, Dr York Chow.

This year, the <u>Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh</u> would introduce changes to certain of their membership examinations. In the specialty of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery, the conjoint Intermediate Examination would change its name to "Membership in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery" with a new format of examination. In the specialties of Endodontics, Periodontology and Prosthodontics, the examinations would separately become "Membership in Endodontics", "Membership in Periodontology", and "Membership in Prosthodontics" respectively with the format and contents of the examinations remained unchanged.

This year the Council had revived the <u>CDSHK Scholarship</u> through which higher trainees and young Fellows could obtain sponsorship to travel and receive training in a renowned centre outside Hong Kong. Two such scholarships were awarded.

The College was the home of all Fellows and Members and I would urge all of you to show your support and to participate actively in all the activities of your own College. Lastly, I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to all the Councillors for their wisdom and guidance, especially the Office-bearers whose hard works were so highly commendable. Special thanks must also go to Ms Rose Chow, Ms Lilian Cheung, Ms Julia Lau and Ms Sharon Tam for their excellent administrative and secretarial support.



- The Conjoint MOS examination was conducted on 15 & 19 November 2010. There were four candidates for the Conjoint MOS examination and two candidates for the MOS examination only. The examination was helmed by the chief examiner Prof L K Cheung. The examiners from the Edinburgh College were Mr Michael Hahn & Mr Peter Douglas. Drs Alfred S H Lee, Derek K Y Tse and W K Tsui were successful for the Conjoint MOS examination.
- A change in format and title of the Conjoint Examination was proposed by the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh (RCSEd). Candidates will be subjected to the same clinical scenarios with the elimination of clinical examination on different patients. Members agreed to continue to hold Conjoint Examination with RCSEd in the new Diploma of Membership in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery (MOMS RCSEd). Members also considered that the new title deemed appropriate in reflecting the higher and wider scope of training required. The inaugural diet of Conjoint MOMS Examination will be held on 5 and 9 March 2012. Candidates were informed and notices of examination were published on both RCSEd and CDSHK websites.
- At the close of October 2011, there are a total of 3 higher trainees and 11 basic trainees registering with the College. Their training progress was evaluated in September with the Trainee Evaluation Form as assessed by their supervisors and trainers.
- Dr Eddie C K Yau resigned from the post of Honorary Secretary of the Specialty Board after years of service. Dr Antonio C K Tong was nominated to succeed the post unanimously by all Members of the Specialty Board.

1. Introduction

The concept of CME has evolved into CPD in the last decade or so. Passive, receptive continuing education activities have been gradually replaced by active, self-initiated professional development. The requirement for quality improvement (QI) is shifting towards quality assurance (QA). CPD activities are no longer merely undertaken to improve our quality of service, but also to fulfil the challenge to show all the stakeholders, i.e. our patients, ourselves, our peer, the community and the policy makers, objectively that our claimed life-long professional improvements do take place.

3. HKAM Programme (CME/CPD Cycle from 1 January 2011 to 31 December 2013) for Fellows:

8. All Fellows, Non-FHKAM Specialists, Enrollees of DCHK Programme and MGD Holders should take the time and effort in submitting all their unclaimed CME/CPD activities to the Secretariat within two weeks after the CME/CPD activities, to ensure their inclusion in the cycle.

9. Applications for accreditation of CME/CPD activities for the first 8 months in 2011 of the current CME/CPD cycle:

From 1 January 2011 and up to the 31 August 2011, our CME Subcommittee has vetted, approved, and accredited a total of 490 scientific meetings held locally and overseas.

10. Differences in CME/CPD points calculation

There are at present three organizations responsible for accreditation of CME/CPD activities for the dental profession, namely the Dental Council of Hong Kong (DCHK), our College and the Hong Kong Dental Association (HKDA). Each of these has its own set of guidelines and differs in the calculation of CME/CPD points. Some forms of unification would be required. The CME Subcommittee has taken the initiative to liaise with the DCHK in this aspect.

11. Future development

The Hong Kong Academy of Medicine is in the process of consulting its constituent colleges about the possibility of mandatory QA CME/CPD requirements. Preliminary discussions have already undertaken at the level of the CME Subcommittee and the Education and Examination Committee.

The DCHK has introduced the requirement of 'essential' CPD points, in the areas of medical emergency/infection control, risk management and radiology in their 2011-2013 cycle. In a recent DCHK disciplinary case, a dentist was ordered to attend structured CME/CPD courses. This has added another new remedial dimension to CME/CPD. These new initiatives of the DCHK call for quality CME/CPD activities to be organized in a more structured manner.

Scientific Meetings Committee

The Scientific Meetings Committee is pleased to report that our 2010 Autumn Scientific Meeting conjoined with European Association of Osseointegration (EAO) represented by Global Council for Osseointegration titled "2010 Joint Congress on Implant Dentistry" was successfully held from November 3 - 5, 2010 at the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building. A total of 23 speakers including 12 from Europe, 9 from Hong Kong, 1 from Japan and 1 from Thailand presented in the 3 days conference. There was around average 200 participants per day part-take this 3-days programme. Of them 48 were from overseas. The presentations in the 3-days programme covered a wide range of topics under six themes related to contemporary science and practice in Implant Dentistry and beyond. The local organizing committee was grateful to industry sponsors namely Geistlich, Henry Schein, Biotech Dental Ltd., Nobel Biocare Asia Ltd, Advance Dental Consulting Ltd, Healthcare Dental Ltd and Quintessence. The expert help of CDSHK colleagues Ms Rose Chow, Ms Lilian Cheung, Ms Julia Lau and Ms Sharon Tam were gratefully acknowledged. Feed backs from conference participants were extremely positive.

Shortly following the November meeting, Prof Edward C M Lo, representing CDSHK, took part in the First Tripartite Congress of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, Academy of Medicine of Malaysia, and Academy of Medicine, Singapore, also the 44th Malaysia-Singapore Congress of Medicine, November 12-14, 2010 at the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building. On that occasion, Prof Lo shared with his audience "New development in prevention and control of oral diseases" among 2 and 1 fellow speakers from overseas or Hong Kong, respectively for a symposium titled *Advances in Preventive Medicine*.

On May 15, 2011, we organized our 2011 Spring Scientific Meeting focusing on the theme regarding special care dentistry. During the morning sessions, we learned from local speakers like *Dr Kenneth K K Hui, Prof Edward C M Lo, and Dr Wendy K M Cham* regarding cleft lip and palate management, root caries prevention/control and patient motivation, respectively. In the afternoon session, we were grateful to have Dr Ken Zhang, Technical Director, Crest Research Institute, sharing with us "Patient-centered practice management" theories and practices. There were over 70 colleagues participating on the day.

The coming Winter Scientific Meeting is now scheduled on November 20, 2011 regarding the theme of endodontic. We are honored to able to invite *Prof Kishor Gulabivala and Dr Y L Paula Ng*, both from UCL Eastman Dental Institute. They are going to share with us the contemporary approaches for successful endodontic therapy.

I would like to thank all the members of the Scientific Meetings Committee nominated by the various specialty boards of the College for their contributions. Special thanks go to Prof Edward C M Lo and Dr Robert P Y Ng who helped with the Spring and Winter Scientific Meeting 2011, respectively and the secretariat of the College for their indispensable assistance in organizing the above scientific events.

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The college was incorporated in Hong Kong on 23rd February, 1993 as a company limited by guarantee. Every member of the college undertakes to contribute, if required, an amount not exceeding HK\$100 to the assets of the college in the event of its being wound up.

The address of the registered office of the college is Room 902, HKAM Jockey Club Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Aberdeen, Hong Kong.

The college is engaged in promoting for the public benefit the advancement of knowledge in the field of dental surgery and its associated subjects and promoting training and research in dental surgery.

The financial statements are presented in Hong Kong dollars which is the same as the functional currency of the college.

2. ADOPTION OF NEW AND REVISED HONG KONG FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS ("HKFRSs")

The Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA") has issued new and revised standards and interpretations that are first effective for the current accounting period.

The following developments are relevant to the College's financial statements:

Improvements to HKFRSs (2009)

The application of improvements to HKFRSs (2009) have had no material impact on the College's financial statements.

The College has not early applied any new standard, amendment and Interpretation that is not yet effective for the current accounting period (see note 13).

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the periods presented, unless otherwise stated.

a) Basis of preparation:

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards ("HKFRSs") (which also include Hong Kong Accounting Standards and Interpretations) issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA"), accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

a) Basis of preparation: (cont'd)

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with HKFRSs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenditure. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgments about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

b) Property, plant and equipment:

Property, plant and equipment, other than construction in progress are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The cost of an asset comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition and location for its intended use. Expenditure incurred after the property, plant and equipment have been put into operation, such as repairs and maintenance, is normally charged to the statement of comprehensive income in the period in which it is incurred. In situations where it can be clearly demonstrated that the expenditure has resulted in an increase in the future economic benefits expected to be obtained from the use of the property, plant and equipment, the expenditure is capitalised as an additional cost of that asset.

Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is calculated by the straight-line method to allocate cost to their residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

College gowns		20% per annum

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date. An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognized upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected to arise from the continued use of the asset. The gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net sale proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset is included in the statement of comprehensive income in the year in which the item is derecognized).

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

c) Inventories:

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is calculated by using the weighted average method. Net realizable value is determined by management based on prevailing market conditions.

d) Impairment:

At each balance sheet date, the College reviews internal and external sources of information to determine whether the carrying amounts of its tangible assets have suffered an impairment loss or impairment loss previously recognised no longer exists or may be reduced. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated, based on the higher on its net selling price and value in use.

If the recoverable amount of an asset is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is reduced to its recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognised as an expenditure immediately.

A reversal of impairment losses is limited to the carrying amount of the asset that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised in prior years. Reversal of impairment losses is recognised as income immediately.

Impairment loss on financial assets which is carried at amortised cost is measured as the difference between the asset's carrying amount the present value of estimated future cash flows discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate.

e) Revenue recognition:

Income from subscription and entrance fees is recognised on an accruals basis.

Income from meeting, course and examination is recognised upon completion of services provided.

Interest income is recognised as it accrues using effective interest method.

f) Related parties:

For the purposes of these financial statements, parties are considered to be related to the college if the college has the ability, directly or indirectly, to control the party or exercise significant influence over the party in making financial and operating decisions, or vice versa, or where the college and the party are subject to common control or common significant influence. Related parties may be individuals (being members of key management personnel, councillors and/or their close family members) or other entities and include entities which are under the significant influence of related parties of the college where those parties are individuals and post-employment benefit plans which are for the benefit of employees of the college or of any entity that is a related party of the college.

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONT'D)

g) Cash and cash equivalents:

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and demand deposits, and short term highly liquid investments which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value, and have a short maturity of generally within three months when acquired, less bank overdrafts which are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the college's cash management.

h) Retirement benefit costs:

The college joins a defined contribution retirement scheme under the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance (the "MPF Scheme") for those employees of the college.

The college's contributions to the MPF Scheme are made based on a percentage of the eligible employees' relevant income as defined in the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance. These contributions are expensed as incurred. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the college in independently administered funds.

i) Government grants:

Government grants are recognized in the balance sheet initially when there is reasonable assurance that they will be received and that the college will comply with the conditions attaching to them. Grants that compensate the college for expenses incurred are recognized as revenue in the statement of comprehensive income on a systematic basis in the same periods in which the expenses are incurred. Grants that compensate the college for the cost of an asset are deducted in arriving at the carrying amount of the asset and consequently are recognized in the statement of comprehensive income over the useful life of the asset.

4. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

4A. CATEGORIES OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The carrying amount of financial assets is HK\$4,178,979 (2010: HK\$3,777,188) which is represented by the aggregate of interest receivable and cash and bank balance in the balance sheet.

The carrying amount of financial liabilities at amortised cost is HK\$579,252 (2010: HK\$261,063) which is represented by the aggregate of accrued expenses in the balance sheet.

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

4. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS (CONT'D)

4B. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The college's major financial instruments comprise interest receivable, cash and bank balances and accrued expenses.

The main risks arising from the college's financial instruments are interest rate risk, credit risk, liquidity risk and foreign exchange risk. The college does not have any written risk management policies and guidelines. However, the board of councillors meet periodically to analyze and formulate measures to manage the college's exposure to these risks. Generally, the college introduces conservative strategies on its risk management. As the college's exposure to these risks is kept to a minimum, the college has not used any derivatives and other instruments for hedging purposes. The councillors review and agree policies for managing each of these risks and they are summarized as follows:

a) Interest rate risk

The college has interest-bearing bank deposits and no interest-bearing liabilities. The councillors consider that the interest rate risk is not significant.

b) Credit risk

As at 31st March, 2011, the financial assets of the college that were exposed to credit risk and their maximum exposures were as follows:

The college carries out its activities in Hong Kong and most of the transactions are denominated in Hong Kong Dollars. Accordingly, the councillors of the college consider the college's foreign exchange risk to be insignificant.

c) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that funds will not be available to meet liabilities as they fall due, and it results from amount and maturity mismatches of assets and liabilities.

Prudent liquidity risk management implies maintaining sufficient bank balances.

As in prior years, the college monitors capital by reviewing the level of capital that is at the disposal of the college. Capital comprises accumulated funds.
