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President's Report

The past year has once again been another busy, productive and memorable year for the College. We had Dr Alfred TSANG Chee Ching, Dr Anthony TSE Siu Kwong and Dr Paul LAU Yun Wah leaving the Council; and we welcomed Dr WONG Yiu Kai, Dr LEE Chun Kei and Dr HO Kam Yuen joining the Council as Councillors for the first time. The College was privileged to have Professor Edward LO Chin Man and Dr CHAN Sai Kwing to continue serving as Vice-President (Education & Examinations) and as Vice-President (General Affairs & CPD) respectively. Dr Edmond POW and Dr Robert NG also continued serving as Honorary Secretary and as Censor-in-Chief respectively. We had a new Honorary Treasurer with Dr WONG Yiu Kai in the post. In January 2012 the College Council reluctantly accepted the resignation of Professor LEUNG Wai Keung but decided to leave the vacancy for 10 months until this year's AGM. Dr Katherine LEUNG had kindly agreed to take up the post as Chairperson of the Scientific Meetings Committee and Dr CHO Shiu Yin as Chairman of the IT Committee.

The Education & Examinations Committee was the most hard working Committee and continued to strengthen the documentation and monitoring of all the trainees. Once again, the College had conducted Intermediate Examinations, jointly with the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, in Endodontics, Periodontology, Prosthodontics and Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery. Exit Examinations were also being conducted in all the specialties except Family Dentistry. Ten new College Fellows were admitted by the Academy on 21 June 2012 and added to the list of FHKAM (Dental Surgery). I would certainly like to congratulate all of them on their hard-earned accomplishment. In August the College Council had appointed Dr K H LEE, Prof Edward LO and Dr Robert NG to visit the training centres of all specialties for the renewal of their status as approved training centres for the College trainees. There were also a couple of applications as new training centres and they had also been visited and approved. Now, we had aligned the visitations for all the training centres whose status would be considered before their expiry in 5 years' time.

Another successful Spring Scientific Meeting was conducted on 20 May 2012 with the theme of "Quality Assurance" which was well attended by participants. The theme of the Winter Scientific Meeting to be held on 18 November 2012 would be on "Geriatric Dentistry". Gratitude must be extended to Dr Katherine LEUNG and her committee members for organizing these highly educational events.

By this time we were almost 2/3 of the way into the present CME/CPD cycle. Our CME/CPD Sub-committee had prepared a revised "Principles & Guidelines on CME/CPD (2012)" for use in the next cycle which would begin on 1 January 2014. The revised version would be available on the College Website for Fellows' reference in due course.

This year the College had a new Chairman for the Committee on General Dentistry, Dr Haston LIU Wai Ming, to head the Committee. With the efforts of Dr LIU and the committee members, training and examination for a second diet of the MGD was able to commence. On behalf of CDSHK Dr Edmond POW had signed an MOU in April with the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons during the RACDS convocation

in Queenstown, New Zealand. As a result, the MGD examination could be held in conjunction with the MRACDS examination for the final viva so that candidates who pass the examination would be able to obtain both MGD and MRACDS. A special diet was conducted in June for those MGD holders by examination in order that they could also reap the benefit from the collaboration with RACDS. Once again the College had appointed HKDA as the Administrator for this diet. The contribution of Dr Haston LIU and Dr Raymond LEE deserved much appreciation. This marked another important milestone for the College in the training of general dental practitioners.

Hong Kong had been designated as a WHO Southeast Asia Centre for Tobacco Control and HKAM had signed a Charter with the Department of Health in the promotion of tobacco control. In March 2012, I represented the College in joining the HKAM delegation to attend the 15th World Congress on Tobacco or Health. It was a rewarding meeting during which I met delegates from all over the world and exchanged views with them on the relevance and importance of tobacco control and oral health.

This year, the Hong Kong Dental Association was given the privilege of hosting the 100th FDI Annual World Dental Congress in August. The College accepted the invitation of HKDA to be a supporting organization for this auspicious event. The Congress turned out to be a hugely successful conference where dentists from all over the world met, enjoyed the superb scientific programme and soaked in the hospitality of Hong Kong people.

This year the Council had once again advertised to invite applications for the CDSHK Scholarship but unfortunately there was no application and so the Scholarship could not be awarded.

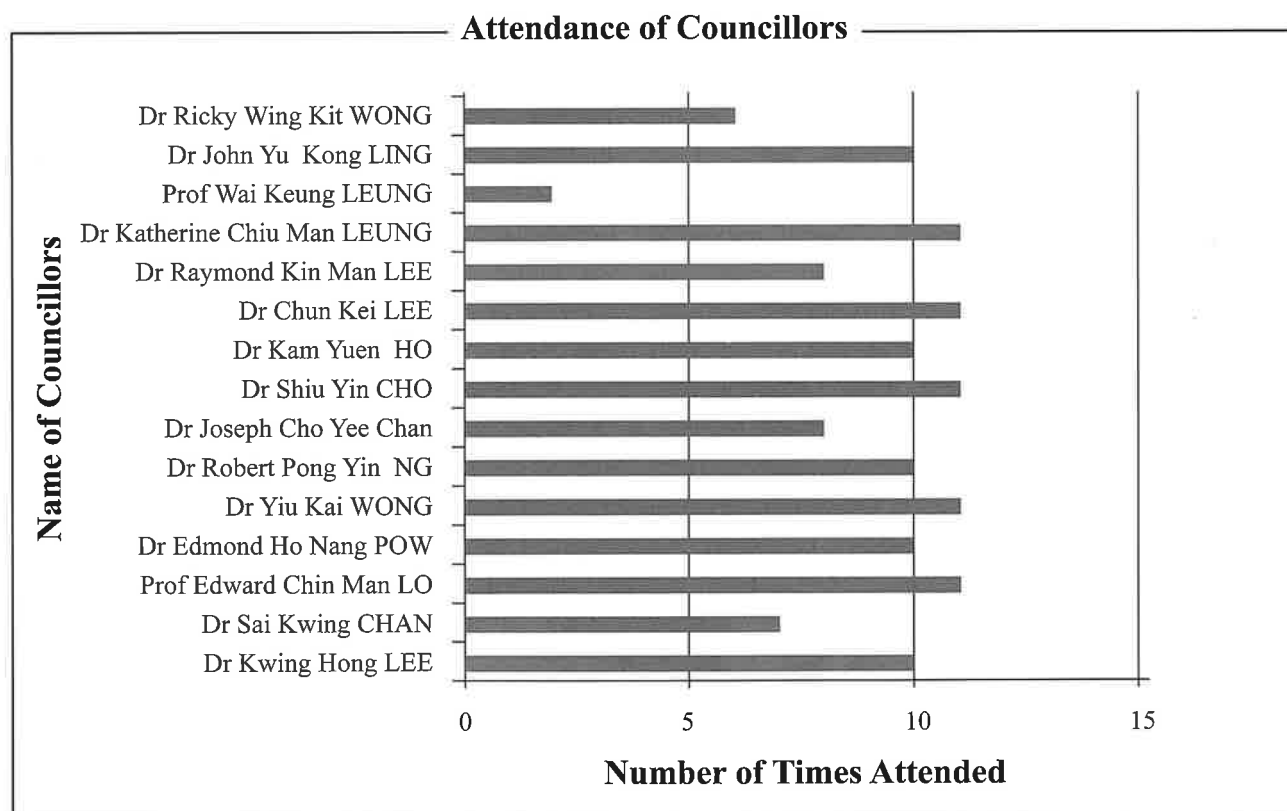

- The Conjoint MOMS(RCSEd), CDSHK(OMS) Intermediate Examination was conducted from 5 to 8 March 2012. There were six candidates for the Conjoint MOMS examination and one candidate for the MOMS examination. This was an inaugural examination under the new format adopted by both RCSEd and CDSHK as the Intermediate Examination of our training pathway. The examination was helmed by the chief examiner Prof Nabil SAMMAN. The examiners from the Edinburgh College were Mr Michael HAHN & Mr John ROWSON. Drs CHONG Mei Man, LAW Yee Hung, LO Ching Man and SO Cheuk Hang passed the Conjoint MOMS examination.
- The Exit Examination of the Fellow of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery, FCDSHK (OMS) was conducted on 2 March and 8 March 2012. Dr YAU Chuen Kam served as the Chief Examiner, supported by Dr YAN Sik-wing, and with Dr Michael HAHN from the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh kindly served as the External Examiner. One candidate, Dr LEUNG Yiu Yan enrolled in this diet of the Exit Examination. It was the unanimous decision of the Examiners that Dr LEUNG Yiu Yan has passed this diet of the Exit Examination of the FCDSHK in OMS.
- The next diet of Conjoint MOMS(RCSEd), CDSHK(OMS) Intermediate Examination will be held from 26 October to 6 November 2012. Prof Nabil SAMMAN will be the Chief Examiner. A total of 3 candidates enrolled for this diet, 2 for the Conjoint Examination and one for the MOMS(RCSEd) Exam only.
- At the close of August 2012, there are a total of 7 higher trainees and 9 basic trainees registering with the College. Their training progress will be evaluated in September with the Trainee Evaluation Form as assessed by their supervisors and trainers.

Continuing Medical Education Subcommittee

1. Introduction

Lifelong learning is not only a necessity for health professionals but also a form of protection for our patients. By excelling the concept of Continuing Medical Education (CME) into Continuous Professional Development (CPD), passive, receptive continuing education activities have been gradually replaced by active, self-initiated professional development.

Quality assurance (QA) is now recognized by the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine (HKAM) as an important component of CPD activities. In face of new challenges, the requirement for CME/CPD is evolving to keep pace with what is expected from the profession by our patients and the community. Work has already been started on a new Principle and Guidelines for the cycle 2014-2016.

2. Composition of the current CME Sub-committee:

3. HKAM Programme (CME/CPD Cycle from 1 January 2011 to 31 December 2013) for Fellows:

All Fellows and Membership in General Dentistry (MGD) Holders, upon completion of their College CME/CPD requirements, are now recognized *en bloc* and deemed to have completed the DCHK Voluntary CPD Programme for Practising Dentists in Hong Kong.

A total of 8 dentists who are not College Fellows or Members had chosen the College as their Programme Administrator. Their CPD profile, as at 31 August 2012, can be summarized as follows:

8. All Fellows, Non-FHKAM Specialists, Enrollees of DCHK Programme and MGD Holders should take the time and effort in submitting all their unclaimed CME/CPD activities to the Secretariat within two weeks after the CME/CPD activities, to ensure their inclusion in the cycle.

9. Applications for accreditation of CME/CPD activities for the first 8 months in 2012 of the current CME/CPD cycle:

From 1 January 2012 and up to the 31 August 2012, our CME Subcommittee has vetted,

approved, and accredited a total of 478 scientific meetings or training courses held locally and overseas.

10. Differences in CME/CPD points calculation

The HKAM has set a mandatory CME/CPD requirement for all her affiliated Colleges since the year 1995. So the CDSHK has our set of guidelines in accrediting CME points on dentally or medically related courses, following closely to those requirements set by HKAM.

In 2002, the DCHK introduced a voluntary CPD points programme, in which the Hong Kong Dental Association (HKDA) and CDSHK have been appointed as both programme accreditors and administrators (Department of Health being the third programme administrator, but not as an accreditor).

The CDSHK CME/CPD programme targets at Fellows, whereas the DCHK CPD programme targets at all dentists. Not only do they have different sets of guidelines, they have different calculation methods and their respective number of points required per 3-year cycle also differ. Nonetheless we have not lost sight of our common goals of lifelong professional education and patient protection.

The CME Subcommittee applauds the introduction of “Essential CPD Requirements” in the areas of medical emergency or infection control, risk management and radiology in 2010 by the DCHK.

With the understanding granted by the DCHK, all Fellows and MGD Holders, upon completing their College CME/CPD requirements, are now recognized *en bloc* and deemed to have completed the DCHK voluntary “CPD Programme for Practising Dentists”. Rather than accepting this as an “exemption”, all fellows and MGD holders are obliged to fulfill such voluntary requirements on par with what are expected from all registered dentists.

11. Future development

The DCHK has introduced the requirement of “Essential CPD Requirements”, in the areas of medical emergency/infection control, risk management and radiology in their 2011-2013 cycle. This gives a clear directive of what are regarded as ‘essential’ from the dental profession by the community. While there is no such definite requirement made by the HKAM or our College, endeavours have been made to organize programmes in these topics. Structured CME/CPD courses have been ordered by the DCHK as remedial education. This brings out the concept of CME/CPD being a form of patient protection, on top of being a means of lifelong professional education.

The Scientific Meetings Committee held its Winter Scientific Meeting on 20th November 2011 at the HKAM Building. I would like to report on the MGD Training Programme preparation in 2012-2014 Diet and the Conjoint Exam with RACDS in 2012.

MGD Training Programme 2012-2014

The CGD has a targeted intake of 50 (for full examination) and 15 (for CAT) applicants for this new diet provisionally. As responses are very positive, there were over 72 candidates who have applied for full examination and 25 candidates for CAT Diet.

As there were over enrolment, applications have been selected by drawing lots by CGD Chairman and one of the CGD Members.

Finally, the CGD has accepted 50 (by full examination) and 25 (for CAT) applications.

MGD Training Programme - Lectures

Clinical Competences Modules (CP), Essential of Dental Practice Modules (EDP), Supervised Dental Practice Programme Modules (SDP) and Supporting Lecture (SP) to be conducted from July 2012 to 2013 provisionally. More modules and Supplementary workshops will also be organized shortly in order to help candidates for their preparation of the examination.

On behalf of the Committee of General Dentistry (CGD), I would like to express my sincere thanks to all the local speakers: Dr Francis W C CHAN, Dr Benjamin K C CHOW, Dr Chun Hung CHU, Dr Simon K Y HO, Dr Angela W L HO, Dr Raymond K M LEE, Dr Thomas K L LI, Dr Arthur W Y PANG, Dr Franklin T T SHE, Professor Stephen H Y WEI and Dr Richie W K YEUNG, for their contribution to the delivery of various topics on general dentistry. Our participants will definitely benefit from their valuable experience.

The College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong (CDSHK) had appointed the Hong Kong Dental Association (HKDA) as the MGD programme administrator. Their professional secretariat and organisation are critical factors for the success of the programme. The CGD would like to show our appreciation to the HKDA's General Dentistry Committee, which under the leadership of Chairman Dr Kenny K K LAU, had contributed unfailing support, tremendous effort and valuable inputs.

Collaboration with the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons (RACDS)

A memorandum of understanding was signed between RACDS and CDSHK to conduct conjoint examination of the MGD and MRACDS in general stream programs on 1 April 2012.

The MGD/MRACDS Conjoint Viva Examination took place on Saturday 23rd June 2012 in the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine Jockey Club Building, Aberdeen, Hong Kong.

The Conjoint Exam went on smoothly and finished on the scheduled time. The rundown of the whole day of the viva exam was strategically arranged so that no Candidate who had

finished the Exam could pass information to another Candidate who would be taking the same clinical case. 17 Candidates passed and 3 failed. The passing rate was 85%.

The CGD would like to express our gratitude to all the local / overseas examiners, observers for all your support to this Examination. Special thanks to the valuable contribution of two Examiners from the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons (RACDS) - Professor Ian MEYERS, and Dr Alexandra JONES, and four Examiners from the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong (CDSHK) - Dr C S KUM, Dr Philip NG, Dr Arthur W Y PANG and Dr B K YIU. There were four observers - Dr Francis CHAN, Dr Daniel FANG, Dr T C FOO and Dr Norman LAW without which our examination would not be a success.

My heartfelt gratitude goes to Dr Raymond K M LEE for his tremendous effort in the liaison with RACDS as well as his helpful advice on examination logistics.

NOTES ON THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong ("the college") was incorporated in Hong Kong on 23rd February, 1993 as a company limited by guarantee. Every member of the college undertakes to contribute, if required, an amount not exceeding HK\$100 to the assets of the college in the event of its being wound up.

The address of the registered office of the college is Room 902, HKAM Jockey Club Building, 99 Wong Chuk Hang Road, Aberdeen, Hong Kong.

The college is engaged in promoting for the public benefit the advancement of knowledge in the field of dental surgery and its associated subjects and promoting training and research in dental surgery.

The financial statements are presented in Hong Kong dollars which is the same as the functional currency of the college.

2. ADOPTION OF NEW AND REVISED HONG KONG FINANCIAL REPORTING STANDARDS ("HKFRSs")

The Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA") has issued a number of amendments to HKFRSs and one new Interpretation that are first effective for the current accounting period of the college. Of these, the following developments are relevant to the college's financial statements:

- HKAS 24 (revised 2009), *Related party disclosures*
- Improvements to HKFRSs (2010)

The impacts on the above developments are discussed below:

HKAS 24 (revised 2009) revises the definition of a related party. As a result, the college has re-assessed the identification of related parties and concluded that the revised definition does not have any material impact on the college's related party disclosures in the current and previous period. HKAS 24 (revised 2009) also introduces modified disclosure requirements for government-related entities. This does not impact the college because the college is not a government-related entity.

Improvements to HKFRSs (2010) omnibus standard introduces a number of amendments to the disclosure requirements in HKFRS 7, *Financial instruments: Disclosures*. The disclosure about the college's financial instruments in note 4 have been conformed to the amended disclosure requirements. These amendments do not have any material impact on the classification, recognition and measurements of the amounts recognised in the financial statements in the current and previous periods.

The college has not applied any new standard or amendment that is not yet effective for current accounting period (see note 13).

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the periods presented, unless otherwise stated.

a) Basis of preparation:

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with HKFRSs (which also include Hong Kong Accounting Standards and Interpretations) issued by the HKICPA, accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with HKFRSs requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenditure. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgments about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

b) Property, plant and equipment:

Property, plant and equipment, other than construction in progress are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The cost of an asset comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable costs of bringing the asset to its working condition and location for its intended use. Expenditure incurred after the property, plant and equipment have been put into operation, such as repairs and maintenance, is normally charged to the statement of comprehensive income in the period in which it is incurred. In situations where it can be clearly demonstrated that the expenditure has resulted in an increase in the future economic benefits expected to be obtained from the use of the property, plant and equipment, the expenditure is capitalised as an additional cost of that asset.

Depreciation on property, plant and equipment is calculated by the straight-line method to allocate cost to their residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

College gowns	20% per annum
Leasehold improvement	20% per annum
Furniture and fixtures	20% per annum
Office equipment	20% per annum

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date. An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

b) Property, plant and equipment: (cont'd)

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognized upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected to arise from the continued use of the asset. The gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net sale proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset is included in the statement of comprehensive income in the year in which the item is derecognized).

c) Inventories:

Inventories are stated at the lower of cost and net realizable value. Cost is calculated by using the weighted average method. Net realizable value is determined by management based on prevailing market conditions.

d) Impairment:

At each balance sheet date, the college reviews internal and external sources of information to determine whether the carrying amounts of its tangible assets have suffered an impairment loss or impairment loss previously recognised no longer exists or may be reduced. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated, based on the higher on its net selling price and value in use.

If the recoverable amount of an asset is estimated to be less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is reduced to its recoverable amount. Impairment losses are recognised as an expenditure immediately.

A reversal of impairment losses is limited to the carrying amount of the asset that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised in prior years. Reversal of impairment losses is recognised as income immediately.

Impairment loss on financial assets which is carried at amortised cost is measured as the difference between the asset's carrying amount the present value of estimated future cash flows discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate.

e) Revenue recognition:

Income from subscription and entrance fees is recognised on an accruals basis.

Income from meeting, course and examination is recognised upon completion of services provided.

Interest income is recognised as it accrues using effective interest method.

f) Related parties:

- (a) A person, or a close member of that person's family, is related to the college if that person:
 - i) has control or joint control over the college;
 - ii) has significant influence over the college; or
 - iii) is a member of the key management personnel of the college or the college's parent.
- (b) An entity is related to the college if any of the following conditions applies:
 - i) The entity and the college are members of the same group.
 - ii) One entity is an associate or joint venture of the other entity (or an associate or joint venture of a member of a group of which the other entity is a member).
 - iii) Both entities are joint ventures of the same third party.
 - iv) One entity is a joint venture of a third entity and the other entity is an associate of the third entity.
 - v) The entity is a post-employment benefit plan for the benefit of employees of either the college or an entity related to the college.
 - vi) The entity is controlled or jointly controlled by a person identified in (a).
 - vii) A person identified in (a)(i) has significant influence over the entity or is a member of the key management personnel of the entity (or of a parent of the entity).

Close members of the family of a person are those family members who may be expected to influence, or be influenced by, that person in their dealings with the entity.

g) Cash and cash equivalents:

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and demand deposits, and short term highly liquid investments which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value, and have a short maturity of generally within three months when acquired, less bank overdrafts which are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the college's cash management.

h) Retirement benefit costs:

The college joins a defined contribution retirement scheme under the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance (the "MPF Scheme") for those employees of the college.

The college's contributions to the MPF Scheme are made based on a percentage of the eligible employees' relevant income as defined in the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance. These contributions are expensed as incurred. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the college in independently administered funds.

i) Government grants:

Government grants are recognized in the balance sheet initially when there is reasonable assurance that they will be received and that the college will comply with the conditions attaching to them. Grants that compensate the college for expenses incurred are recognized as revenue in the statement of comprehensive income on a systematic basis in the same periods in which the expenses are incurred. Grants that compensate the college for the cost of an asset are deducted in arriving at the carrying amount of the asset and consequently are recognized in the statement of comprehensive income over the useful life of the asset.

4. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

4A. CATEGORIES OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The carrying amount of financial assets is HK\$3,920,017 (2011: HK\$4,178,979) which is represented by the aggregate of interest receivable and cash and bank balance in the balance sheet.

The carrying amount of financial liabilities at amortised cost is HK\$7,270 (2011: HK\$579,252) which is represented by the accrued expenses in the balance sheet.

4B. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The main risks arising from the college's financial instruments are interest rate risk, credit risk, liquidity risk and foreign exchange risk. The college does not have any written risk management policies and guidelines. However, the board of councillors meet periodically to analyze and formulate measures to manage the college's exposure to these risks. Generally, the college introduces conservative strategies on its risk management. As the college's exposure to these risks is kept to a minimum, the college has not used any derivatives and other instruments for hedging purposes. The councillors review and agree policies for managing each of these risks and they are summarized as follows:

a) Interest rate risk

The college has interest-bearing bank deposits and no interest-bearing liabilities. The councillors consider that the interest rate risk is not significant.

b) Credit risk

The college is exposed to credit risk, which is the risk that a counterparty will be unable to pay amounts in full when due. The company's maximum exposure to credit risk in the event of the counterparties failure to perform their obligations as at 31st March, 2012 in relation to each class of recognised financial assets equal to the carrying amounts of those assets as stated in the balance sheet. The company's credit risk are monitored on an ongoing basis.

The credit risk on liquid funds is limited because the counterparties are banks with high reputation.

c) Liquidity risk

Please refer to page 15.

d) Foreign exchange risk

The college carries out its activities in Hong Kong and most of the transactions are denominated in Hong Kong Dollars. Accordingly, the councillors of the college consider the college's foreign exchange risk to be insignificant.

e) Fair value estimation

The college's financial assets and financial liabilities have their carrying amounts approximately equal to their fair values due to their immediate and short-term maturities.

c) Liquidity risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that funds will not be available to meet liabilities as they fall due, and it results from amount and maturity mismatches of assets and liabilities.

Prudent liquidity risk management implies maintaining sufficient bank balances.

The following table details the remaining contractual maturities at the balance sheet date of the college's financial liabilities which are based on contractual undiscounted cash flows and the earliest date the college can be required to pay.

- To support the college's stability and growth; and
- To provide capital for the purpose of strengthening the college's risk management capability.

The college actively and regularly reviews and manages its capital structure to ensure optimal capital structure, taking into consideration the future capital requirements of the college and capital efficiency, projected operating cash flows and projected capital expenditures.

As in prior years, the college monitors capital by reviewing the level of capital that is at the disposal of the college. Capital comprises accumulated funds.

13. POSSIBLE IMPACT OF NEW AND REVISED STANDARDS AND AMENDMENTS ISSUED BUT NOT YET EFFECTIVE FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH, 2012

Up to the date of issue of these financial statements, the HKICPA has issued a number of new and revised standards and amendments which are not yet effective for the accounting year ended 31st March, 2012 and which have not been adopted in these financial statements.

The college is in the process of making an assessment of what the impact of these new and revised standards and amendments is expected to be in the period of initial application. So far it has concluded that the adoption is unlikely to have a significant impact on the college's results of operation and financial position.
