Synopsis

Geriatric dentistry is not just dentistry for the older people. MGD should understand why older people may suffer more dental diseases and tooth loss, and hence be able to apply the principles of life-long prevention of dental diseases and preservation of natural teeth on clients of all age in daily practice. The principles underlying the Seattle Care Pathway will be introduced enabling clinicians to plan appropriate dental treatment for patients with different degree of frailty. The ultimate goal of geriatric dentistry is to extend healthy life expectancy and minimise the disease burden to patients towards their old age.

Synopsis

Special Care Dentistry is already a specialty among the many fields of dentistry, in many overseas countries, but not in Hong Kong yet.

Dr Hui is a veteran dentist who has an unfailing passion working for patients with special needs for many years. He witnessed many dental personnel starting off with tremendous enthusiasm to serve these special care patients, but not all of them could sustain and be consistent to serve these patients for an extended period of time.

Like a little child attends the first dental appointment and starts crying on entering the surgery because of "dental-phobia", a few dental personnel might have similar "special-care-patients-phobia" and decline to provide treatment for them.

If we can spend the time to understand their medical, psychological, physical and social conditions better, together with some management techniques, and address to their dental needs, more than minority of these special need patients can be handled in a normal dental setting.

Dr Hui will take this opportunity to share with you his limited knowledge in this field, and hopefully enough information to encourage you to take up the challenge to manage, may be a few of them, if they knock at your clinic door one day.

(Remarks: In 2015, Dr Hui was recommended to, and appointed by, Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, as one of their examiners in the Membership Examination in Special Care Dentistry, for a duration from 2015 to 2017. He is currently responsible in the training course in Special Care Dentistry in Prince Philip Dental Hospital.)

Synopsis

Oral medicine and oral pathology are one of the largest scopes in Dentistry and these include diseases involving both the hard (cysts of the jaws) and soft tissues (oral mucosal lesions) of the oral cavity. The dental practitioners are often the first line health care workers who encounter these lesions. Proper diagnosis and early referral are essential in some of the cases. In addition, patients who have various medical conditions or various medical inventions, e.g. anti-coagulant or bisphosphonate, could sometimes complicate our dental treatment, i.e. special precautions are usually required. This seminar will discuss the diagnosis and management of various common oral pathologies and mucosal diseases. An update on medical problems related to dentistry will also be given.
