In July 2009, HKDA and CDSHK came to an agreement for HKDA to be the administrator of the Membership in General Dentistry (MGD) training program 2009-2011. The program is supported by various specialist societies which are accredited CPD providers of the Dental Council of Hong Kong (DCHK).

The training program is mainly designed to prepare the MGD trainees for the MGD Part I and Part II examinations. It is a competence-based program according to the guidelines of accreditation and training in MGD. For further details, please refer to CDSHK's website (www.cdshk.org).

The training program is module-based, consisting of CGD (Committee of General Dentistry) accredited lectures and workshops on clinical practice and essentials of dental practice on General Dentistry. There are some supporting programs to guide trainees in examination preparation and they can be useful to interested practitioners.

The modules are useful to colleagues who aspire to keep themselves abreast of the contemporary practice of General Dentistry and those who may wish to enroll as trainees in the next diet of examination. The credit points carried in completing the program will be counted as part of the requirements of the MGD training and examination. 

Dr Cheng is a Fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons, College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong and Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. Dr Cheng is a part-time clinical lecturer in the Faculty of Dentistry, the University of Hong Kong and a private practitioner.

Dr Ho received his BDS in 1992 from the University of Hong Kong. After a year of private practice, he became a Dental Officer in the Government Dental Service since 1993. He obtained MDS (Periodontology) in 2004 and Advanced Diploma in Periodontology in 2006. Synopsis : Implant placement to replace missing teeth is a common treatment option nowadays. The principle of osseointegration has been established for decades with numerous scientific evidences. However, implant related studies are still under active research. This presentation will cover the basic science of osseointegration, bone physiology and biomechanics in implant and implant-supported prosthesis. Clinically, treatment planning for implant therapy with prosthetic and surgical considerations and treatment alternatives will be discussed. Participants will be able to identify clinical indications and contra-indications for implant placement and to assess hard and soft tissue characteristics that may influence the treatment outcomes. The importance of regular maintenance and monitoring on implant-supported prosthesis will also be emphasized.

Synopsis : Management of patients with periodontal diseases is the bread and butter for many dentists. The clinical history and presentation of periodontal diseases varies in a wide range; together with other conditions that may affect the dental gingival area mimicking periodontal disease may make diagnosis become difficult. The presentation will discuss various aspects in diagnosis of periodontal conditions as it is the basis for any appropriate treatment there come after. The presentation will also look at the clinical management of periodontal diseases including non-surgical, surgical and regenerative therapies. Different alternative treatment approaches such as full mouth disinfection, adjunctive systemic or local antibiotics, laser therapy will also be discussed. Emphasis will be put on how data obtained from the literature can be transferred and used properly to the actual clinical situation.

Oral Medicine, Oral Pathology and Oral Microbiology

Dr Yeung attained Bachelor of Dental Surgery from the University of Hong Kong in 1985 and received M.B.Ch.B from the Chinese University of Hong Kong in 1992. He joined the Faculty of Dentistry of the University of Hong Kong in 1994 and was responsible for both undergraduate and postgraduate teaching. He attained Fellowship of Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh and Hong Kong and holds the specialist title of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. He had published many papers in international journals including rehabilitation of post treated oral cancer patients, dental implants and temporomandibular disorders. Dr Yeung is currently engaged in private practice in Hong Kong.

Synopsis : Oral Medicine and Oral Pathology are a major branch of Dentistry. Basically we deal with local mucosal disease and bone disease as well as oral manifestation of systemic disease. We can make diagnosis usually by spot diagnosis but most of the time we need also blood testing, radiography, histopathological examination, imaging technique and even microbiology to achieve correct diagnosis. Treatment including local and systemic therapy and from time to time we may have to have the assistance of internal physician to deal with the systemic disease and then we deal with the oral symptoms.

In the lecture, we would like to categorize the different disease groups like mucosal lesion red and white lesion, salivary gland disease and the oral manifestation of systemic disease. Current ways of investigation and treatment will be briefly discussed.

Medical Emergencies

Associate Professor Douglas Stewart is the Program Director of the Graduate Diploma in Clinical Dentistry (Conscious Sedation & Pain Control) at the University of Sydney. Following completing his dental studies at the University of Sydney, Associate Professor Stewart travelled to the United Kingdom and took a keen interest in sedation, pain management and medical emergencies. Upon his return to Australia in 1995 he became involved with teaching sedation, pain management and resuscitation at Westmead Hospital and the University of Sydney. He is also a senior staff specialist and head of department, Clinical Support, at the Westmead Centre for Oral Health. Associate Professor Stewart is also President of the International Federation of Dental Anesthesiology Societies, the Oral Health Foundation, the Dental Alumni Society of the University of Sydney and is Honorary Secretary of the Australian Society for Dental Anaesthesiology. He also is a Consultant on Sedation for the RACDS and an examiner for the MRACDS.

Synopsis : The first part of the presentation will address the common causes of collapse and medical emergencies in the dental setting. The basic physiology, anatomy and pharmacology will be covered including vaso-vagal syncope, cardiac arrest, anaphylaxis, laryngospasm, diabetes and seizures. Drugs and equipment will be discussed in the treatment of emergencies and there will be a great emphasis on teamwork.

The second part of the presentation will examine simulated medical emergencies and how we can learn practical lessons from them. The background of medical simulation comes from critical flight simulation where pilots practice critical care without crisis to their passengers or staff. The use of Anaesthetic Crisis Resource Management (ACRM) will be encouraged and these principles include: know your environment, anticipate and plan, call for help early enough, take a leadership role, communicate effectively, allocate attention wisely and use all available information, and, finally, distribute the workload and utilise all available resources.

This lecture series emphasizes the importance of doing something quickly in order to avoid disaster in the dental setting!
