In July 2009, HKDA and CDSHK came to an agreement for HKDA to be the administrator of the Membership in General Dentistry (MGD) training program 2009-2011. The program is supported by various specialist societies which are accredited CPD providers of the Dental Council of Hong Kong (DCHK).

The training program is mainly designed to prepare the MGD trainees for the MGD Part I and Part II examinations. It is a competence-based program according to the guidelines of accreditation and training in MGD. For further details, please refer to CDSHK's website (www.cdshk.org).

The training program is module-based, consisting of CGD (Committee of General Dentistry) accredited lectures and workshops on clinical practice and essentials of dental practice on General Dentistry. There are some supporting programs to guide trainees in examination preparation and they can be useful to interested practitioners.

The modules are useful to colleagues who aspire to keep themselves abreast of the contemporary practice of General Dentistry and those who may wish to enroll as trainees in the next diet of examination. The credit points carried in completing the program will be counted as part of the requirements of the MGD training and examination. Management of Paediatric Patients

Professor Stephen Wei is a Professor Emeritus and the former Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry and Director of the Prince Philip Dental Hospital in Hong Kong from 1989 to 1997. He was the Chair Professor and Head of the Dept. of Children's Dentistry and Orthodontics from 1984 to 1998. Prior to returning to HK, he was a Professor and Chairman of the Department of Pedodontics at the University of Iowa as well as the University of California, San Francisco.

He was the President of the International Association of Dental Research in 1993-94 and was the President of the SEAADE and SEAIADR in 1989-90. He holds Honorary Professorships at Peking University, West China University, Shanghai Second Medical University, Wuhan University, Sun Yat-Sen University of Medical Sciences and Tongji University. He has published more than 6 books and 200 scientific and clinical papers and edited many color monographs in Endodontics, Aesthetic and Restorative Dentistry.

Professor Wei was the founding President of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong, the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. He was also the Chairman of the Board of Examiners of the Dental Council of Hong Kong for more than 10 years. He has lectured internationally. He has been serving as the President of the Hong Kong Society of Paediatric Dentistry since 2006.

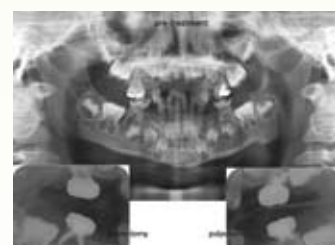

Synopsis : This module will introduce MGD trainees to the examination of paediatric patients from infancy through adolescence. It will include the techniques of examination, diagnosis and treatment planning. The contents will cover commonly seen oral conditions and their clinical management including commonly encountered trauma to the dentition and the soft tissues. The treatment of dental caries with the latest restorative materials and techniques will be described. In addition, the management of teeth with pulpal involvement by using indirect pulp capping, pulpotomy and pulpectomy techniques will be shown. MGD trainees are also expected to recognize the development of malocclusion and early interception with guided occlusion techniques including serial extractions will be described.

Pain and Anxiety Management

Professor Stephen Wei is a Professor Emeritus and the former Dean of the Faculty of Dentistry and Director of the Prince Philip Dental Hospital in Hong Kong from 1989 to 1997. He was the Chair Professor and Head of the Dept. of Children's Dentistry and Orthodontics from 1984 to 1998. Prior to returning to HK, he was a Professor and Chairman of the Department of Pedodontics at the University of Iowa as well as the University of California, San Francisco.

He was the President of the International Association of Dental Research in 1993-94 and was the President of the SEAADE and SEAIADR in 1989-90. He holds Honorary Professorships at Peking University, West China University, Shanghai Second Medical University, Wuhan University, Sun Yat-Sen University of Medical Sciences and Tongji University. He has published more than 6 books and 200 scientific and clinical papers and edited many color monographs in Endodontics, Aesthetic and Restorative Dentistry.

Professor Wei was the founding President of the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong, the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine. He was also the Chairman of the Board of Examiners of the Dental Council of Hong Kong for more than 10 years. He has lectured internationally. He has been serving as the President of the Hong Kong Society of Paediatric Dentistry since 2006.

Synopsis : This course will demonstrate different approaches to recognize and manage the anxious, nervous and phobic paediatric patients and their parents in the dental office. Dentists should be able to provide appropriate behaviour modification techniques to allay the fear and anxiety of their patients. The ability to administer "painless" local anesthetic solutions using the proper techniques should be a pre-requisite to all other forms of needed treatment. Dentists should be familiar with the use of various medicaments to allay fear and anxiety using rectal, oral, inhalational and IV routes of administration of medicaments for the patient. Dentists should be competent in the use of nitrous oxide including the proper equipment and concentration of oxygen and nitrous oxide. A dentist must be knowledgeable of the Guidelines for Sedation for Paediatric Patients. When deep sedation is used, the dental team must be fully trained in the administration of the IV method including resuscitation and life support procedures. Cooperation with an anesthesiologist fully trained in the Monitored Anesthetic Care (MAC) techniques is a pre-requisite for deep sedation cases.

Musculoskeletal and Occlusal Therapy

Dr Au Yeung obtained his BDS (HK) in 1992, MDS (Prosthetic Dentistry) in 1996. Dr Au Yeung served as a Government Dental Officer for ten and a half years before starting his private practice in 2007. During his service in the Government, Dr Au Yeung worked extensively on advance prosthodontics, maxillofacial rehabilitation and implant dentistry.

Dr Au Yeung is a fellow of the Hong Kong Academy of Medicine, the College of Dental Surgeons of Hong Kong, the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons and the International Congress of Oral Implantologists.

Besides maintaining his private practice, Dr Au Yeung also teaches in the Prince Philip Dental Hospital as a part-time Clinical Lecturer. He has served as a Council Member in the Hong Kong Dental Association since 2005.

Synopsis : Results from dental literature indicate that the prevalence of TMJ and muscle pain in different population groups remains high and is significantly affecting the daily activities of many individuals. Very often, the first health care professional group who encounter patients with such problems is their dentists. With proper assessment and treatment, most of these conditions could be successfully managed conservatively under a general dental practice setting.

This course will concentrate on the screening, assessment and conservative management of patients with temporomandibular pain dysfunction syndrome (TMD). Emphasis will also be put on the role of occlusion in relation to TMD.

At the end of the course, participants should be able to:

1. Assess and examine patients with TMD.
2. Perform conservative treatment for patients with TMD, including the use of intra-oral appliances.

 - review of updated international guidelines on management of trauma to permanent teeth
3. **Early Interceptive Orthodontic Treatment in the Mixed Dentition**
 - review of various types of treatment for anterior crossbite
 - demonstration of composite inclined plane for single incisor in crossbite & hands-on
 - introduction of new advances in interceptive / pre-orthodontic / habit correction appliances

Synopsis : General dentists often find clinical orthodontics mysterious and difficult. The course aims to enhance general dentists' experience in diagnosing malocclusions and dentofacial deformities, communicating with patients on why and when they need to be referred to specialist for orthodontic treatment and subsequently working closely with orthodontists to provide comprehensive treatment to patients.

The course (Lecture and Workshop) is not a revision on what you have learnt in undergraduate training. It focuses on the scientific rationale on how orthodontists make diagnosis, formulate treatment options, design specific appliances to execute the treatment plan and minimize possible risks by working closely with general dentists.

The following areas will be covered in this Lecture:

1. Risks of orthodontic treatment (by Dr Flora LAM Sze Van)
2. Four dimensional orthodontic diagnosis and treatment planning (by Dr Franklin SHE Tsang Tsang)
3. Fixed appliances biomechanics and appliance design (by Dr Franklin SHE Tsang Tsang)
